Events Near and Across the County Liner. Several thousand cigars belonging to Jessee Bickel, eigar manufacturer, in New Hanover township, Montgomery county, have been seized for alleged violation of the revenue laws.

The Phonixville & West Chester railroad has been completed, with the exception of putting on the last lot of ballasting. The officials of the road, accompanied by President Roberts and other officials of the Pennsylvania railroad, it is stated, will pass over the new line to-day on a tour of inspection.

William Shoemaker, of York, committed assault upon his son, Lewis, who brought suit against him for assault and battery and surety of the peace, before Justice Sherwood. The father took sick in the evening and seemed to be in great trcuble. He remarked to several persons that he would not live long. He gradually got worse during the night and Friday forenoon, and about noon he died.

Five cars and the engine of a Cumberland Valley railroad train were wrecked about eleven miles from Harrisburg Friday evening. The cars were full of passengers, but no person was injured. The engineer and fireman stuck to their engine and were thrown a considerable distance. The accident was caused by running over a cow. The loss will foot

up at least \$20,000. At Nancy Run, Lehigh county, the barn of Robert Scheeitzer was destroyed by fire. It contained two thousand shocks of wheat, fifty-five shocks of rye and the crop of 20 acres of other grain. Three cows and their calves were badly burned and one horse was very badly injured. The Freemansburg fire department saved the adjoining wagon shed, farm house, etc., from destruction. There was insurance on the barn and stock. The cause of the fire is not known. The loss is \$5,000.
