MGR. CAPEL'S ARRIVAL.

The Eminent English Divine Among Friend

The steamer Arizona, of the Guion line, arrived at her dock, foot of King street, New York, at half past 9 o'clock Monday morning. Among the more prominent passengers was Monsignor Capel (Disraeli's Catesby in "Lothair"), the eminent English divine and Catholic controversionalist. Monsignor Capel is a man of fine physique, about 6 feet in height and built in proportion. On leaving the vessel he was surrounded by the passengers, who had been won by his genial and affable manners during the voyage, and who were desirious to pay their respects to him on parting with such a pleasant companion. He said to a reporter of the Eveniny

Telegram: "From Florence I proceeded to Paris, where I was present at the death bed of my dear old friend, Mr. John Ryan, and administered the last sacrament of the church to him. From Paris I went to London and embarked on the Arizona. My voyage was remarkably pleasant. I go from here to the Brunswick and thence to the church of the St. Francis Xavier, in West Sixteenth street. I leave in a short time by the Pennsylvania railroad for the home of Mrs. T. B. Baldwin, at Edgewater Park, Burlington county, N. J., where I shall rest for two week. Then I shall proceed to Newport to visit my acquaint. ances there and prepare my programme for a lecturing tour. It is sixteen years since I was here before."

After resting at the Hotel Brunswick after his arrival, he called upon Cardinal McCloskey and Archbishop Corrigan at noon and had a brief interview with each. He left New York, at 4 p m. for Burling. ton, N. J., where he will make a short visit to some friends. During his stay he proposes to lecture in some of the principal cities on secular and religious questions. Among other things he will lecture on art, painting, travel, education, and Catholicism and other subjects. One of the principal objects of his visit is to study American institutions and observe their influence upon the growth and devolopment of the Roman Catholic religion He will travel extensively thoughout the West, going probably to San Francisco, and during his journeying he intends to carefully study the American educational system of which he says he has a high opinion. He will preach frequently.
