LOUISVILLE'S GALA DAY.

dent Arthur Opeus the Exposition Ami Wednesday was a general public holiday at Louisville, there being no business whatever. With the first streak of daylight crowds of people began pouring into the city from every point of the compass Trains were doubled up, and by 9 o'clock the main streets were so full that it was difficult to pass along the sidewalks. The president rested well during the night and was ready by 11 o'clock next morning to take his part in the exercises of the day The presidential party left the Galt house in carriages, escorted by a body of police and local military, and moved by the most direct route to the exposition building. Their way was a perfect ovation the entire distance, the thousands of people yelling themselves hoarse as their distinguished visitor passed. The great main building, capable of holding 20,000 people, was filled completely and the crowd was too thick for comfort. President Dupont, of the exposition welcomed the president in a speech President Arthur gracefully responded and concluded by starting the vast ma chinery and pronouncing the exposition open. A DUEL TO THE DEATH.

The Meeting of a Desperado and a M Marshal.

At the colored village of Brooklyn, in the American bottom opposite St. Louis, a trightful duel took place midnight Wed nesday between City Marshal HenryGreen and an ex convict desperado named Jones. The latter, with a companion, had been engaged all day in an endeavor to hunt down and kill a stranger who was sus pected of being a detective from Chicago. looking for some of the hard characters who often seek a hiding place in Brooklyn, and knowing that his men were around with shotguns and small arms, Green supplied himself with these weapons and started in pursuit.

He met Jones about midnight, and after short parley opened on him with both barrels of his shotgun. The buckshot carried away the entire flesh from lett upper arm. The men then closed, and in the struggle Jones got the first shot, sending a bullet from his revolver into the officer's groin Green followed with a shot which pas sed though the desperado's body. men were then separated and carried off. Each has since died, Green linger ing until Wednesday morning and Jones until Wednesday afternoon. Jones was one of the most desperate men in the American bottom, bad shot several people and served two terms in the penitentiary.

Greek With Stockings.

The ' Ædipus" of Sophocles, the Greek tragedy which Harvard students acted two years ago, has just been put on the stage of the theatre Francaise in French. Miss Ober reproduced the Harvard performance in our theatres with all except the principal role translated into English. She has seen the Paris performance, and says of it : "There is a great deal of con servatism at the Francaise, and the double stage, the choruses, and a good deal of the music were suppressed, so that the Greek tracedy might resemble as much as possi ble an ordinary French drama. The chorus is reduced to a lot of mute supernumera ries and two young girls, who alternately recite the strophies which ought to be sung by a full chorus. Notwithstanding all the resources which the French may have for obtaining correct models, ours were certainly more graceful in clinging dra pery as well as more effective in dramatic expression. According to the knowledge we have in America of Greek history, there were no stockings or sleeves worn, and with us only bare arms, legs and feet were seen upon the stage. But here I saw characters wearing shoes, sandals, even boots, some with long sleeves, and some with stockings, others with bare arms and bare feet, just as they seemed to prefer. The costumes were of all colors and of many textures, and the draperies seemed to have been lost sight of entirely." The acting, however, was fine.

Posoned by Drinking Beer Dregs. At Shenandoah Austin Jones, a boy of ten years, was poisoned Wednesday morn ing by drinking the dregs of a beer keg. The keg was lying in a gutter in front of a saloon and he poured the beer left in it into a tin cup and drank it. Going home he was seized with terrible pains.
