peace, find it easier for their weak natures to humor them and to connive at thus oppressed and tyrannized over by this minority, who laugh at law and hound the defenders of the law. The only end of this enormity will be in the union of the majority, and this can never be effected by extreme measures or fanatical pronunciamentos.
