LATE NEWS FROM EUROPE. Marshal Davitt Very Sick—Suppressing Secret Societies in Hungary.

DUBLIN, Sept. 12.—Michael Davitt is very ill with an attack of inflammation of the lungs. His sickness has necessitated the cancellation of all his engagements to address National League meetings in various parts of Ireland.

Getting ready for war. PARIS, Sept. 12.—The Figaro states that the Chinese army is concentrated at Pekin, and only waits the news of the arrival of French reinforcements at Port Said to invade Tonquin.

Secret societies surprised. AGRAM, Sept. 12.—The police have surprised some secret societies here which have been endeavoring to direct riots against the Jews. Several officers of the societies have been arrested.

France in a tremor. CARTRHAD, Sept. 12.—A panic was caused in the theatre here last night by a false alarm of fire. The doors were locked and many of the audience escaped through the windows. When the doors were forced open the audience escaped, but several were injured.

A TERRIBLE AFFAIR. Cowboys' Bloody Fight in a Dark Room. DENVER, Col., Sept. 12.—The details of a bloody affray on Sunday at McLean rancho, in Elbert county, in which eight cowboys took part, have just reached here. Two of them named Rossitor and McKeever, fought in a room tearing at each other like tigers while their companions flourished revolvers and howled in encouragement.

Trains Wrecked. WILLIAMSBURG, Conn., Sept. 12.—The engine of the second section of a freight train bound east, on the New York & New England railroad, broke on the train at Andover, this morning. A train following behind the wrecked train, consisting of which eight cars were wrecked and seven derailed. A brakeman had his leg broken and two cars were burned. The track was blocked and the passengers were transferred.

Big Texas Fire. TERRILL, Tex., Sept. 12.—The Houghton block was entirely destroyed by fire yesterday. Among the losers are Childress & Bro., saddlers, \$10,000; Shortridge Haughlin & Co., \$8,000; and the Sunny Clinic, a newspaper published by deaf mutes. Loss \$1,000. Other losses are heavy.

Case Up for Trial. READING, Sept. 12.—The case of Peter Cullen, formerly chief of police of Reading against the Philadelphia & Reading railroad to recover a reward of \$15,000 for the arrest and conviction of the rioters who burned the Lehigh Valley car, is called for trial to-day, but was postponed until next term, owing to the absence of President Gowen.

A W. U. Telegraph Officer Resigns. NEW YORK, Sept. 12.—At a meeting of the directors of the Western Union telegraph company to-day Mr. J. Lowber Welsh, of Philadelphia, resigned as a director and Mr. C. G. Baldwin, president of the Louisville & Nashville railroad, was elected to fill the vacancy.

A Wreck Near Easton. EASTON, Pa., Sept. 12.—A freight train on the Lehigh and Susquehanna railroad was wrecked this morning at Siegfried's Bridge. Eight cars were demolished, and the tracks were blocked. All trains will be delayed several hours, passengers and baggage being transferred at the scene of the accident.

Fire in Kentucky. LEXINGTON, Ky., Sept. 12.—Fire this morning in stables of Lexington fire car burned up fifty mules, 14 cars and entire lot of harness and stock of feed. Three copies and stables adjoining were also destroyed. The fire was incendiary.
