MAJOR ROBERT TAGGART.

Democratic Candidate for Auditor General of Pennsylvania.



The achievements of the Pennsylvania Reserves, contribute a very important chapter in the history of the part which our state bore in the late struggle of the war for the Union. They were a body of soldiers who were distinguished alike for gallantry of service and for the perils they encountered. Recruits presented the best elements of the citizen soldiery and no better types of the citizen soldier who saved the republic were to be found in the army than the Reserves. Every commander under whom they served attested their endurance and heroism, and every battle field upon which they fought tells the story of their soldierly qualities. The life of the Democratic candidate for auditor general is the story of one of these men, who in the flush of his manhood, responded to the call of his country, and when the war was over took his place as a citizen, identifying himself with one of the great material interests of his native state; and who, ever since, has filled that place with credit to himself and honor among his fellow citizens, meriting and commanding the universal respect of the community in which he has resided for the uprightness of his personal character and the integrity of his conduct in all the relations of life.

As his name indicates, Robert Taggart is of that stock of immigrants from Northern Ireland who have peopled so many sections of this state, and whose strong vitality impressed upon the social and political character of the commonwealth. His parents came over to this country in 1830 and settled in Pittsburgh, where a half a century ago the Scotch-Irish was the most influential element. His father was a student of law, and was engaged extensively in this business. He was a man of strong individuality with keen appreciation of the benefits of education and after giving his son Robert a thorough common school education designed him for a college course. His only surviving brother, Rev. Samuel Taggart, is a minister of the United Presbyterian church and has been for nearly fifty years pastor of the church in West Middletown, Washington county, Pa.; he is the father of the S. A. Taggart, state secretary of the Y. M. C. A.

Robert Taggart was born in Pittsburgh in 1836, and was one of a family of five boys and three girls. The eldest brother died in the military in South Carolina; the second, John J., former judge of the Allegheny ward public schools of Pittsburgh, died in that service. A younger brother, Samuel, left the theological seminary where he was preparing for the ministry to enter (Rev.) Col. Clark's regiment, in the Union army at Gettysburg, and was killed in the battle of Petersburg, Va., while charging upon the enemy. William is still a resident of Pittsburgh, being superintendent of the Baker car heating company. It is notable that all five of the Taggart boys were in the Union army at one time, the youngest entering the service at the age of 16. Not even the famous family of fighting McCooks can show a better record than that.

After completing his education in the common schools, young Taggart applied himself to the organization of literary societies. In these he was associated with Andrew Carnegie, the great manufacturer, and Samuel Harper, now a prominent lawyer of Pittsburgh, and later his society was merged with one of the Union army at Gettysburg, and was killed in the battle of Petersburg, Va., while charging upon the enemy. Jay Gould Heated by Fitzer.

On his usual trip up the Hudson on Wednesday evening Jay Gould's steam yacht Alalanta came alongside Yosonoma, which had Mr. Tilden and his party on board. A race was begun in good earnest. For several miles it was even, but by degrees the Yosonoma forged ahead, and at last she dropped her anchor off Greystone the Alalanta was several lengths behind. One of the engineers of the Yosonoma, in conversation with a reporter ashore, said that the boilers of the Yosonoma were tested at 120 pounds, and that she was allowed to run at 110 pounds. Mr. Tilden, the engineer said, enjoyed the race, but was not informed how much steam the boilers were carrying. Mr. Gould will not allow a pressure of more than 70 pounds on the boilers of the Alalanta, although they are tested for 130 pounds.
