Trouble about a Lease. Quite an excitement was caused this morning on North Queen street, because of a difficulty between Wm. M. Shrum, owner, and John R. Kaufman, lessee of the store room N. 116 North Queen street. Mr. Kaufman is a druggist and has been in possession several years with only a verbal lease, but had paid his rent regularly. Last week he removed his stores to No. 56 North Queen street, locked up the vacated premises, and kept the keys, holding that his lease did not expire until the first of April next. On Kaufman returning from the premises, Mr. Shrum rented them to another druggist, and as Kaufman refused to give up the keys, he forced his entrance by breaking the door leading from the cellar to the store room, and demanded the removal of other articles Kaufman had left in the room. Kaufman made complaint, and obtained from Alderman Fordney a warrant for Shrum's arrest and he was taken into custody by Officer Smith while he was enroute to the police station. The complainant is Lewis Mizell, who has also been arrested at the instance of Lewis, on the same offense in this county.

NEW RAILROADS.

The Coalbrook Valley Opens To-day.

To day the new Coalbrook Valley railroad, extending from Conewago to Cornwall, and the Coalbrook and Lebanon railroad extending to Lancaster, via Coalbrook, to Lebanon are being opened with appropriate ceremonies. Quite a large number of prominent Lancaster county people are left in attendance. The following named left in the Pennsylvania depot in this city this morning: J. A. Hiestand, George Calder, A. J. Kauffman, B. F. Brainer, George Steinman, A. J. Stelman, G. W. Henzel, W. U. Hensel, James Collins, John Keller, A. H. Peacock and a few others. The new roads will prove to be of great convenience to persons traveling between Lancaster and Lebanon, as they shorten the distance more than 21 miles as compared with the route heretofore traveled via Harrisburg, and the fare is reduced from \$1.94 to \$1.29 cents. The trains connecting with the road at Conewago station are the mail train which leaves this city at 9:30 a. m., and the Harrisburg express which leaves at 7:30 p. m.

The Roads Opened.

A dispatch from Lebanon to the INTELLIGENCER this afternoon says:

The new Cornwall & Lebanon and Conbrook railroads, connecting Lebanon on the Philadelphia & Reading railroad, with Conewago, on the Pennsylvania railroad, a distance of 22 miles, were opened today. Over 2,000 excursionists passed over the roads. The visitors here were welcomed with an address by Col. J. P. Gibon, and were banqueted at the several hotels by the citizens. The new roads open a rich territory and will connect the Conewago valley with all points on the lines of the Pennsylvania and Philadelphia & Reading railroads. Mr. Robert Coleman owns both of the new roads.

POULTRY.

Artificial Diamonds.

This morning the machine shops of Isaac Broome & Son, located at Clinton, were destroyed by fire, which was discovered about half past two o'clock. Nothing was left standing but the walls of the building having been stone. About \$2,500 worth of materials were destroyed. The machinery was very valuable and of course was now useless. The building was insured. The principal business at the shop was the manufacture of turbine water wheels and about 35 men are thrown out of employment.

Deaths.

Hanneman. In this city, on the 29th instant, John Henry Hannemann, in the 57th year of his age, committed suicide by drowning in the water from Wednesday and the body was slightly decomposed. Deputy coroner H. H. Rydor, of Lemon Place, empanelled the following jury: David W. Edwards, Elam W. Estleman, A. L. Carpenter, Shaw W. Frew, Eschleman Martin and William Kyler, who rendered a verdict of suicide by drowning during a fit of temporary insanity. A post mortem examination was made by Dr. A. H. Smith, of Paradise, owing to a cut above her left eye, but the supposition is she struck it against a stone when she plunged into the water. The remains were sent to the county hospital where they were recognized by the inmates of the institution. The deceased had been a son of John and Mrs. William H. Hannemann.

Count of Common Pleas. The first week of October common pleas court began this morning, with Judge Livingston on the bench.

When the list was called it was found that 26 cases were ready for trial.

The case of Adam Camau vs. Jacob Hoop, action for wages was settled.
