THE PITTSBURGH EXPOSITION BUILDING BURNED.

A Handsome and Costly Structure in Ruins - The Exhibition Building Destroyed - The Loss Heavy.

PITTSBURGH, Oct. 3.—About 2 o'clock this morning the exhibition building caught fire and in 20 minutes the entire structure, with the machinery and floral halls were in ashes.

The fire was discovered in the engine room in the machine department, and in order not to frighten the citizens a still alarm was sent out so that the fire department was not called.

The exhibition consisted of all varieties of our products and industries. The destruction of the building complete.

The origin of the fire is still uncertain. The estimate of the loss before given was greatly exaggerated. It will probably reach \$1,000,000.

An irreparable loss was occasioned by the destruction of the relic department. The cash value of the articles contained therein did not exceed \$10,000.

Among the rumors current is one that the fire originated through an incendiary act. The fire was caused by an explosion of benzine being used by Prof. Warner the balloonist.

Another fire. Boston, Oct. 3.—A fire occurred at Attleborough, Mass., early this morning. The building burned with services held in the venerable Christ Church on Second street, near Market, the cornerstone of which edifice was laid in 1727.

The church was crowded, 1,108 tickets having been issued for the service. At 10:25 the procession of the clergy filed in as the 23rd hymn was sung.
