**THE CHURCH EPISCOPAL.**

The Prayer-Book Discussion to Come Up To-day.

The degree of interest in the Protestant Episcopal convention can usually be gauged by the crowded appearance of the galleries in Holy Trinity church at Philadelphia. The board of missions, which was in session yesterday, adjourned until Friday, after disposing of the question of the missionary canon, which is still pending. The subject of the work among the colored of the South will be received, to allow Bishop Dubley, the assistant bishop of Kentucky, to speak. This morning the house of delegates will meet in the usual way and at noon, if nothing happens to interfere with the regular order, will take up the report of the committee on the revision of the prayer-book, a subject that is expected to bring forth much discussion.

Between the hours of two and three o'clock to-day a social meeting will be held in the parlors of the Aldine hotel, to admit of the interchange of fraternal greetings between the bishops and of deputies and their friends. To-morrow at noon is the time appointed for taking up the report of the committee on lectionary concerning changes in the celebration of feast days. Some important reports will be acted on to-day. The first is report No. 2 of the committee on canons relating to the tentative use of alterations to the book of common prayer; the second the report of the committee on rules of order, the third the report of the committee on the consecration of bishops; and forth, report No. 3 of the committee on the prayer-book, relating to a change in the title of the prayer-book and of the ordinal.

Last night, in Holy Trinity church, a meeting in behalf of temperance was held, at which the lord bishop of Rochester and several others spoke.
