We have seen extensive and highly cultivated farms by subsequent injudicious cultivation degenerate into barrenness; and we have not many miles to go to see the once sterile sand-plains of Jersey, by systematic tillage, liberally rewarding the systematic tillage, liberally r proper labors of the husbandman. Land there that was formerly covered with rank grasses, huckleberry bushes and stunted pines, now yields in an abundance the choicest varieties of grapes, pears, cherries and apples, and all the field crops that can be profitably grown in the adjacent states. Good tillage having developed the true character of this once comparatively unproductive soil, has in many localities enhanced its pecuniary value, and there a century ago land that could not be sold for five dollars an acre, would not now be disposed of for a hundred dollars an acre. Thus, as the value of the soil of New Jersey for agricultural purposes becomes disclosed the quantity and worth of her grain, fruit and vegetable products steadily increases, and will continue to do so.
