SATURDAY'S TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

How the Festive Cowboys in Dakota Territory Indulge in their Peculiar Amusements in the Streets.

BISMARCK, Dak., Oct. 20.—The trouble at Glendive, Montana, on Sunday night last grew out of an attempt, made by the city marshal to arrest three drunken cowboy boys who had been amusing themselves in that peculiar style affected by these gentry during their periodical visits to town and which usually consists of firing their pistols in all directions allowing chance to decide whether they will kill any body or not and making the day or night hideous with their howls.

At Phillipsburg, N. J., this morning by the bursting of an engine wheel William K. Krymer was killed and David Kutler and James Knox were injured.

At Barnsby, Eng., 12 bodies of the Wharfedale Carlin explosion have been recovered.

The race between Mojolica and Trinket at New York has been postponed until Thursday October 25th.

An avalanche at Asaro in Catania yesterday buried six people five of whom were killed.

Andrew Fogarty was sentenced to two years in the state prison to-day by Judge Deque at Newark, N. J., for manslaughter in killing Jeremiah Ryan of South Amboy.

At Toronto the action brought by Mr. Darn a colored man against the Windsor school board to compel that body to admit his daughter to the public school has been decided in favor of the defendant.

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 20.—Pennsylvania officials say that the report that a systematic course of embezzlement has been going on in the office of the Junction railway company and that a paymaster is in default about \$21,000, is untrue. The report originated, they say, from the fact that a clerk in the employ of the company was found about a month ago to have embezzled between \$2,000 and \$3,000. He is the son of a reputable citizen, who immediately paid the deficiency and the young man was discharged. No further irregularities have occurred and none are expected.

A Crowded Platform Falls. BOSTON, Oct. 20.—A platform crowded with spectators who were watching the scrub races of the Harvard men on Charles river to-day broke down and several persons were severely injured, having their limbs broken. Most of those injured are Harvard men.

An Assistant Bishop Consecrated. NEW YORK, Oct. 20.—The consecration of Rev. Dr. Henry C. Potter, assistant bishop of the diocese of New York, took place this morning at Grace church, New York.

Strike of Switchmen. DALLAS, Tex., Oct. 20.—The switchmen at the yards of the Texas Pacific and Missouri Pacific railroads struck last night for an advance in wages from \$4.00 to \$4.50 per month. Several freight trains in the East, Dallas yard were abandoned. Telegrams have been sent to Fort Worth for marshal and men who it is thought will reach Dallas to-day. The strikers are stubborn and say that no one else shall touch a car until their demands are allowed.

Shot While Hunting. READING, Pa., Oct. 20.—Daring Miller, aged 31, of Gouglersville, this county, went gunning Friday and not returning search was made this morning and he was found dead from the effect of a gunshot wound in the abdomen, in the woods a mile from his home. His gun was found 300 yards from the body and how he received the wound remains a mystery.

Death of an Insurgent. ALGERIA, Oct. 20.—The report of the death of the Algerian insurgent Chief Se-Sliman is confirmed. He was invited to a feast by two other chiefs who slew and decapitated him and sent his head as a present to the sultan of Morocco.

snocks of Earthquake Felt at Gibraltar. LONDON, Oct. 20.—Three shocks of earthquake felt; quick succession were felt at Gibraltar shortly after midnight and another at two o'clock this morning. The direction of the movement was from north to south.

A Jury Discharged. CAMEL, N. Y., Oct. 20.—The jury in the case of the negro Riley on trial for the murder of Mrs. Sanderlin have disagreed and have been discharged. The prisoner was remanded.
