THE SINKING FUND.

Further Time Asked by the Counsel for the Auditor General and State Treasurer.

Counsel for Auditor General Lemon and State Treasurer Baily disappointed the Republicans at Harrisburg yesterday morning by not filing an answer to the writ of mandamus of Attorney General Cassidy commanding the execution of the *Humes Law* directing investment of the sinking fund surplus in United States or state bonds. After Attorney General Cassidy had reminded the court that this was the day for the filing of the answer of the sinking fund commissioners, Leman D. Gilbert, of counsel for the auditor general and state treasurer, said that he had not understood that they were required to file an answer Monday, but simply to appear.

Further, the secretary of the commonwealth, who was a member of the board, had failed to act with them, and prepared an answer himself. For these reasons counsel for the respondents desired time to prepare their answer. Attorney General Cassidy thought it very strange that this misunderstanding should exist and urged that the case proceed. He said the mandamus proceedings had no political significance, and Mr. Gilbert expressed his agreement with this declaration. Secretary of State Stenger, in his answer, says that ever since the passage of the *Humes Act* he has been anxious to execute it in full letter and spirit, to the end that the state might keep large sums of money from the investment of the sinking funds, but he had been slow in so doing, and had waited for so doing by the action of a majority of the board of sinking fund commissioners. He therefore prayed that the writ of mandamus be made permanent and absolute. The court gave counsel for the sinking fund commissioners until Saturday to file their answer.

**YOUNG WHITEMORE'S DEATH.**

The Lad's Father and a Woman Arrested for a Horrible Crime.

Mrs. Ellen Whitemore, a widow, and Whittemore, the father of the boy found in the river with a bullet cut, of Princeton, N. J., have been arrested to the murder. The detectives who took the case had their suspicions turned to Mrs. Long because of the rumors that she had once attempted to poison Whitemore's wife and infant. In searching her house, they found bloody clothes which she had been wearing up to the time of the murder, and a butcher knife and two razors stained with blood. In a well on her premises was found a club with blood marks on it.

The neighbors say that a criminal intimacy has existed between the widow and Whitemore and that it was known to his 11 year old son, who was probably thus disposed of to stop a scandal. The boy was missing for ten days but the father made little effort to find him. The theory is that the boy was killed by Mrs. Long because of the rumors that she had once attempted to poison Whitemore's wife and infant. A Coarse street fight.

Jacob Boyer and William Merts engaged in a fight at an early hour yesterday in a saloon at the corner of York and Noble streets, Philadelphia. After the fight had continued for some time the men were ejected from the saloon and renewed the quarrel on the sidewalk. Lewis Gable, of 407 Callowhill street, interfered, with the purpose of separating the men, but was promptly knocked down. John Buckley, of 420 North Sixth street, then joined in the fight. He was knocked down and is thought to have been kicked, as when he was subsequently picked up, his leg was found to be broken. Boyer and Merts were arrested and committed to prison in default of \$2,990 bail each.
