AFTERNOON TELEGRAMS.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—Four quiet and steady. PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—The schooner Arab was sunk off the coast of Rhode Island Sunday morning. The tug Proteoction was disabled while taking off the crew of the Arab and was towed by a steam barge until the latter became disabled on Monday night. The tug then drifted until she came to anchor near the pier. Capt. Kelly, of the Arab, went down with his vessel and a launch which was struck by a board. A stiff northerly breeze was blowing last night and the life saving crew could not get outside the harbor to rescue the crew of the Proteoction. The lake is very rough and other disasters are expected.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—The House today added to the appropriation bill about \$17,000 for the pay of the clerks. The bill then passed the second reading. The House considered the appropriation bill on second reading. The motion for appropriate \$50,000 for the salary of senators instead of \$91,182 originally given in the bill was lost. A separate clause appropriating \$7,900 for the pay of the chief journal clerk, journal clerks and reading clerks and message clerks of the Senate was agreed to, as was a similar clause appropriating \$9,000 for House clerks. The chaplain's pay was increased from \$300 to \$548. The bill then passed second reading. Adjourned.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—A meeting was held at the mayor's office this afternoon for the purpose of devising means for the relief of the sufferers from death and disease. The balance, \$2,500, collected for the sufferers by floods in the South and West and not called for, was voted to the Shenandoah sufferers and \$1,900 besides was subscribed. The meeting is still in session.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—A suit in ejectment was entered in the United States circuit court this morning by the U. S. government against John Shipley, for the recovery of 17 acres of oil land in Forest county, which the defendant is in possession of a quit claim.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—Two burglars, Frank Harrison and Charles Wilson, serving terms for five and four years respectively, escaped this morning from the mess room of Sing Sing prison, by sawing an iron bar.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—Wm. E. Brockway, Lewis Martin and James B. Foster, who were arrested on Sunday last charged with counterfeiting and forgery, were today indicted by the grand jury for forgery in the first degree. They were committed for trial.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—The Pennsylvania legislative committee to inquire into the alleged bribery by E. B. Duttonson by the Standard oil company began a session today, and will examine several members of the Standard company residing here.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—Nine burglars were convicted and today sentenced to various terms in the penitentiary. They have been operating for a long time to the terror and alarm of the inhabitants of a large district.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—The Western rail association today ordered a general suspension of the rail machines for five weeks, beginning December 23. No change is made in the card rate.
