Dr. Billings lectured yesterday in Hop-kins hall on "Schools." He said: "A characteristic of modern civilization is the

attention given to education. In some European countries it is made compulsory, and the provision for free schools in this country, although large, is not equal to the ever increasing demand. At present the interests of mental training often conflict with those of bodily, and deformity and disease are often caused. The dangers to health from school life are those connected with plans and location of school buildings; those connected with the course and methods of instruction; those

discases. "The most common defects in buildings are that they are too small for the number of scholars, and have too insufficient means for ventilation. The three most important things in a school building are security from fire, proper light and satisfactory ventilation. The importance of good light in the study room is beginning to be felt.

"Many children have eyes which are

connected with the spread of contagious

danger that these may become worse under circumstances that would not seriously affect normal eyes. The abnormalities are more frequent in Germans or children of German extraction. It is believed that the amount of shortsightedness and other defects is increasing, but a large part of the apparent greater frequency of defects is due to improved means of diagnosis and the greater attention which is given to the to improperly directed light while studying at home or at night. The greater amount of shortsightedness in city schools is due probably to the greater amount of study done at night, much of it by the light of flickering, uncovered gas flames. An im-portant feature, then, in the hygiene of the eyes of school children is to limit the amount of night study. In the school room the light should not be in front of the pupils, neither behind them, but if possi-

ble from both sides, or from the left side. "The great defect in city schools is in ventilation. Each student should have thirty cubic feet of air per minute, which, with proper airing of the room during intermissions, will keep the air pure. To me more good than all other medicines and introduce this amount of air steadily into treatment I have received combined. And to a room containing forty of filty children, and so distribute it that each child shall get his share without unpleasant draughts requires special arrangements and careful supervision. It is evident that we must allow the same amount of air to escape, and as this carries off heat, it will require much more fuel to warm a well ventilated room than one where the least possible amount of cold air is admitted, and as school boards usually judge of the merits of a heating and ventilating apparatus and of the janitor by the amount of fuel used,

found, etc. The evil effects of excessive study are more frequently produced in girls from 13 to 17 years of age than in any other class of pupils, and the results do not appear often until several years

this by watching the thoughtless ways of children. The means of proventing this and other dangers of school life consists tagio constant skilled medical inspection of schools. The good effect of such measures have been seen, notably in Brussels. School boards in this country are as a rule unfavorable to such a system of inspection -partly on account of the expense, partly from fear of interference and criticism. Still I believe that the city of Baltimore could secure the services of a competent physician who would give his whole time to promoting school hygiene, and his salary would be an excellent investment."

A ROYAL ROOM. The Prince of Wates' New Ball Room,

ondon Times. The new ball room which his royal highness the Prince of Wales has had erected during the past summer was used for the first time at the county ball given

Formerly the entrance hall of Sandring ham house was used for the purpose of a ball room, but the prince has had a new wing constructed at the south side of the mansion, at right angles, between the house and the office. This has been car ried out from the designs and under the superintendence of Mr. Robert W. Edis, F. S. A. architect, London. In this wing a spacious and elegant ball room has been constructed with a corridor connecting it with the remaining portion of the house, and behind it have been provided new telegraph and post offices. The principal portion of the wing is occupied by the ball

room, the general effect of which suggests great purity of design and perfection of execution.

Passing out of the corridor into the ball room the visitor might almost imagine himself in the interior of a Russian ball or any disease of the Throat and Lungs, a subject to the correct of the C room as regards delicacy of color, and there is a delightful sense of light airy \$1.00. coolness. The room is 66 feet long by 30 feet 6 inches wide, the walls being 18 feet high from the floor. The ceiling, which is technically described as wagon headed in shape, and elaborately panelled is 23 feet high in the center. On either side of the room are deep-recessed alcoves, 25 feet long by 4 feet deep. The south alcove is filled with windows, and the north with a

magnificent fireplace. There are large bay windows at each end and at the east end is the minstrels' gallery, the front of which is an open, white, areaded balustrade, and it is covered with moulded ribs filled in between in relief, in the form of a very perfect speci men of stamped leather paper. The ceiting is elaborately panelled after the man ner of 16th century houses in England, of which Crewe hall is so fine a specimen. An elaborate cornice of frieze nearly two feet leep goes quite around. The plain surface of the walls is painted a delicate fawn color, the lower portion being panelled as a high dado, with mask and scroll orna mental frieze, in all 7 feet high. The two central alcoves are supported by columns and pilasters of a composite character, the upper portion being fluted, and the lower elaborately carved with mask and scroll ornaments. The south alcove is fitted up up with the fire grate and mantelpiece, which is a very imposing work. The

grate, which is a very fine design, is con-structed of brass and iron, the sides of the fireplace are lined with tiles painted with figures and foliage in delicate tones of brown and yellow, and the whole is en-framed with bold mouldings of Siena marble, which is carried round the basis of the carved trusses which support the columns of the superstructure, the whole being elaborately carved and furnished with a pedimental head. A projecting centre panel has been arranged to receive a

picture. The whole height of the mantelpiece is about 16 feet, within a couple of feet of the cornice. The hearth is laid with mosales with Siena marble fender. All the windows in the ball room are internally arched, with recesses in which the blinds and curtain are hung to render unnecessary ordinary curtain poles. The floor is of

oak with simple parquet bordering. The whole of the ceiling and decorations are white, and the latter have all been designed and moulded especially for the signed and moulded especially for the room. For dancing purposes it is lighted by three large centre gas lights in the roof specially designed by Mr. Edis, which serve for the purpose of ventillation as well, the foul air being pumped into a central external turret. There are also two light gas brackets projecting from the walls, fitted with opalesque globe, which throw out a soft light The walls are at present being decorated
