O'DONNELL HANGED.

HE MEETS DEATH WITH COMPOSURE. WALKS FIRMLY TO THE SCAFFOLD AND SMILES AS HE IS CONDUCTED TO IT.

LONDON, Dec. 17.—O'Donnell, who killed Captain Carrivick, was hanged at the gallows to-day. He was perfectly composed and expressed great sorrow for the outbreak of temper in the dock, at the conclusion of his trial, when he cursed the English government and bid an adieu to Ireland and the United States. He said that he had felt the greatest animosity for the witnesses against him, but that had now altogether disappeared, and he was ready to meet death.

The prisoner walked with much firmness and without any assistance up the stairs of the scaffold, and was perfectly calm and self-possessed when standing on the fatal drop. After the communion was administered to him, Binns, the hangman, who has been in Newgate for some days, pincioned the condemned man, who smiled as the action was done. The solemn procession then moved toward the scaffold, which last evening was carefully re-examined and tested to assure the authorities of its perfect effectiveness.

Binns performed the rest of his duty quietly and methodically. He allowed a drop of eight feet, and precisely as the black cloth struck him, he pulled the lever, and O'Donnell fell.

Two thousand people were in front of Newgate at the time of the execution, and the utmost good order was observed. The body and the rope had made a loud rattling for one hour, when it was cut down and removed for the proper legal deposit.

The usual inquest showed that the face of O'Donnell bore a calm expression. The head was quite loose from the trunk of the body and the rope had made a deep indentation. The usual verdict was returned.

Another Victim. DUBLIN, Dec. 17.—Peter Wade has been sentenced to be hanged January 16, for the murder of Mr. Quinn, at Rathfriland, county Dublin. The prisoner stated that he belonged to a secret society whose orders he obeyed.

WASHINGTON NEWS. The Senate adjourned on Tuesday to meet on Wednesday. The signal service station at Duluth, Minn., reports that the schooner Mary Ann had been wrecked during the gale of Wednesday night of November. Twenty lives were lost.

His Death Warrant Read. WASHINGTON, Dec. 17.—The governor's warrant, ordering the execution of Charles Dillman, convicted of the murder of his wife, in February last, and fixing February 19, as the day for the hanging, was read to the prisoner this morning. He admitted his guilt and said he would prepare to meet his fate.

Philadelphia Dec. 17.—Attorney General Cassidy was unable to attend a meeting to-day of the Legislative committee in charge of the investigation of the Pennsylvania National Bank. The session of the committee was therefore postponed until December 27th.

A Well-Known Physician Dead. PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 17.—Dr. Thomas S. Kirkland, for over 40 years physician-in-chief and superintendent of the Pennsylvania Hospital for the Insane, died at the institution last night, aged 75 years.

Weather Indications. WASHINGTON, Dec. 17.—For the Middle Atlantic States, cold, clearing weather, winds backing to westerly, rising barometer, followed during Tuesday by cloudy weather with snow, winds shifting to warmer southerly and falling barometer.

Recent Fatalities. By an explosion of gas in the Cannock colliery at Sharncliffe, Saturday afternoon, Elias Neil and John Smith were burned, the former fatally.

United States Marines were drowned at Portsmouth, N. H., Friday night, by the upsetting of a boat.

HASTY MARRIAGES AT OXFORD.

The Orestes Green for Impatient Couples from Maryland and New Jersey. Rev. Samuel Dickey, president of the Oxford National Bank, has in his possession a very curious and in a measure a very mysterious manuscript. It is the autobiography of the late Rev. R. P. Dablos, who for half a century was pastor of the Presbyterian church at the little hamlet of New London, near Oxford, Chester county. During his long service in New London Mr. Dablos married 2,400 persons, a record considering the very limited extent of the charge, probably without a parallel in the church history of this country.

The autobiography, which, at his death a few months ago, Mr. Dablos left to Mr. Dickey, has only been seen by a few of the most intimate personal friends of the dead clergyman, and is kept from profane eyes at the request of the author.
