

RAILROAD WRECKS.

NARROW ESCAPE AT LANCASTERVILLE.

Two Trains Attempt to Pass Upon One Track, Without Success—The Engines Caught Up, but So Did Not.

The line of the Pennsylvania railroad from Philadelphia to Lancaster, via Landisville, is a single track road. The fast passenger trains all run that way and when two pass each other one of them turns out upon the siding, of which there are a number.

There are two differing accounts of the cause of the accident. According to one of these the eastern bound train had orders to take the siding and allow the other to pass.

About 11 o'clock that night the train drawn by engine No. 760, which had several car loads of stock for the yards in the eastern end of the city, crossed over from the south track for the purpose of detaching the cars.

This morning a bad wreck occurred near Middletown. The engines of the News express, which leaves here at 6:25, and Columbia accommodations collided.

Wednesday Evening, Dec. 26, 1883. Pending Strikes. Trouble in the Soft Coal Fields. A General Reduction of Wages Expected in Pennsylvania—30,000 men to go out.

Pittsburg, Dec. 26.—A special dispatch from Monaca, Pa., says: "There are lively prospects of extensive trouble in the bituminous coal districts in Westmoreland, Blair, Huntingdon, Bedford, Centre and Clearfield counties. The producers are extremely reluctant as to their plans, but it is pretty generally known that a reduction of wages in all departments of labor will be exacted after Dec. 31st.

Good Feeling Not Restored. The rupture between the Rochester and Pittsburgh railroad company and their militant miners is not entirely adjusted notwithstanding the report to the contrary and an undefined feeling of uncertainty prevails in the striking districts.

Mail is coming into New York very slowly, the storm having delayed them from all points. Those from the east were three hours and those from the south two and a half hours late, while western trains due at 8 a. m., had not been heard from at eleven o'clock.

Long Branch Railroad ran on the Pennsylvania railroad on the track at Long Branch junction this morning. Pinco, the engineer, was killed; he leaves a wife and child. The train was thrown down an embankment and totally wrecked. The cause was the snow and track spreading. All the Long Branch trains were sent to New York by the Philadelphia and Reading railroad to Elizabeth.
