ROSY SUNSETS.

SEEN ALL OVER THE WORLD.

Their Brilliancy in Naples-Gorgeons Dis plays in Switz-riand-The Sights on the Pacific In South Australia

From the following reports it will be observed that the magnificent displays of color in the Western skies, noticed in this latitude for a few months, have been ob served in all parts of the world :

-Ascribed to Cosmic

A Naples correspondent of the London Times says : For three evenings in suc cession we have witnessed what the popular voice considered to be an aurora borealis. On Friday night the sky became decked with a reseate or even blood color: the same phenomenon was observed on Saturday night, and, in a less degree, last night. On the first occasion the colors were varied, blue and green being inter mixed with red, but there were none of those spiral coruscations which are re garded as a leading feature in the aurora borealis. Still it was a magnificent spec tacle, and superstition has been active in pronouncing it as foreboding evil. Unfortunately for the present illusions of many, Prof. Semmola, who not long since had a flattering reception from the French academy, has published the following letter in the Rema: The purple red color which has illuminated a part of the sky in the early evening or at dawn for several days, has inclined people to set it down as an aurora borealis. On the contrary, it is due to a crepuscular brilliancy, a phenomenon which in certain special conditions of the vaporisity of the air, as sumes so splendid an appearance as to be mistaken for what it is not. It differs from the aurora by the position in which it has been seen, by its duration and by the absence of magnetic or electric phe nomenon." Last night it was particularly splendid in the west southwest. A black belt of cloud lined the horizon, and from that point nearly to the zenith the sky was lit up with a purple red color, in which the cresceut moon was set as a gem. On the other evenings the same appearance was visible in the east or southeast From the north to the south of Italy the same phenomena were observed. I remember, however, to have witnessed a magnificent aurora at Naples some ten years ago, and it was followed by most tempestuous weather; but judging from appearances there can be no fear of that now, as the sun is shining brilliantly in a cloudless

sky. Golden Glory In the Alps.

A correspondent of the London News writing from Geneva, says: Switzerland has not been behind other countries in the matter of gorgeous sunsets. For several evenings we have been treated to spectacles that are rare even in this country, and are certainly most unusual at this time of the year. One in particular was very strik ing. Another phenomenon, almost unprecedented in this part of the world, was witnessed on the lake a few evenings ago. The steamer Jura was proseeding on her voyage up the lake, and when off Nyon the whole of her rigging and masts were suddenly enveloped in "St. Elmo's Fire," which glowed with a pale, lambent flame. The effect was not only singularly beautiful, but wierd and startling. The weather prophets here say that these phenomena presage a severe and hard winter, and so far their prediction has been justified, as the cold weather has set in at least 3 weeks earlier than usual. It was preceded by a very heavy fall of snow, and since then the thermometer has called here the bise has been blowing for several days. In ordinary years the bise

is not looked for until after Christmas.

In the South Seas.

From Adelaide observatory, South Australia, comes the following in the Cure for all coughs and colds. official report for October : "On every clear evening during this month and the last fortnight in September a peculiar phenomenon has been apparent in the western sky. Shortly after sunset a red glow will make its appearance, at an altitude of about 50 degrees, being very faint at first, but as the brightness of the sky near the horizon dies away with the receding sun the red glow will expand down wards, becoming at the same time more brilliant, until at last the whole western sky will be lit up with a beautiful light, varying in color from a delicate pink to a most intense scarlet, and the spectacle presents a most brilliant appearance.

The upper part will then gradually fade degrees or 8 degrees above the horizon, at which time the light is about its brightest. Afterwards a secondary glow will sometimes make its appearance at an altitude of about 50 degrees, and gradually spread downwards until the sky is again lit up. In the secondary phenomenon the colors are generally more delicate. The whole thing will fade away about 8 p. m.

"This phenomenon has been noticed all over the southeastern portion of the continent, from Port Augusta (lat. 32 deg. S.) to Melbourne; and in India the sun has at times presented a most peculiar appearance, being green at rising, and gradually changing to a bine at noon, and inversely from noon to sunset. Various theories have been started to account for the phe-

Mr. J. J. Winaut, writing to the San Francisco Examiner under date of Dec. 13, says : " During the month of September I was on my way to Honolulu from San Francisco, and I first noticed the phenomenon about the middle of the month, and when about a thousand miles from the islands. The sight at sea was truly wonderful and beautiful, the sky becoming crimson, and even the sea, when calm, assuming a pink tint, as though reflected from some burning mountain, and the light would remain long after sunset. 'That such dust exists and has been found is well known, but how much or little its presence near the earth is noticed is a question not easily determined. discoveries of Professor Nordenskjold in the North are interesting. For many years he has been a close observer of dust of all kinds that have fallen upon the earth in rain or snow, and it was his good fortune, during his expedition in the Vega to prove beyond a doubt the presence of cosmic dust. For many years we have been assured by astronomers that the earth was being bombarded, as it were continually, by innumerable meteors. The moment they enter our domain, we observe the spectacle of their ignition. In a moment they are reduced to ashes, and the fine, impalpable dust drops slowly, an invisible shower, upon the earth. such showers are intensified, it is not im-

phenomena may be the result," A correspondent of the London Times argues thus in support of the theory that electricity has had much te do with the phenomenon: "When we take into consideration the movements of the atmosphere and the rotation of the earth, I see no reason to doubt that an immense cloud of highly electrified matter, projected into the atmosphere in Java, could spread itself in the higher regions of the atmosphere over an area equal to that of

Europe. "That this is not fanciful is proved by the behavior of smoke. I have often watched when at sea on a still calm day the black smoke of some passing steame rise to some determined height and then gradually spread itself at an equal and constant distance from the sea like a great flat pall. I have also seen on land the smoke from some manufacturing shaft blown gently by the wind follow the curves of the land, remaining always at the same distance from the ground, but gradually spreading outwards in every direction. I have also seen two lines of smoke refuse to coalesce, but repelling each other exactly as they ought if they were similarly electrified. That smoke is therefore, negatively electrified I firmly

believe, though I have never tested it.

"Now that this wonderful atmospheric disturbance was accompanied by extraordinsry electrical disturbance was shown not only by Captain Watson's observations near the spot, but by Prof. Smith's records at Madras, and hence it require no great stretch of the imagination to conceive electricity playing a great part in the recent gorgeous display of atmospheric effects."
