Give the fowls coal ashes or sand to dust in if the ground is frozen. If not spade it up occasionally.

Grade your perches so that the heavy fowls such as Brahmas and Asiatics will not be compelled to fly high to roost.
The cultivation of carp is still in its infancy in this country and promises to be conducted on an extensive scale.

One of the most wasteful methods of applying manure is to let it out in small heaps, spread in the spring after the grass begins to grow. By this practice the outside of the heap dries very hard, and when spread in the spring the lamps do not soften but remain hard and dry to obstruct the mow and to be raked with the hay.

For "splin" in horses take oil of amber, oil of spike, spirits of turpentine. Equal quantity of each; apply twice a day, and grease with a lard.

The question is frequently asked, how often and how much should window plants be watered, and scarcely any one, not even a florist, can tell you just what you want to know.
