A Young Wife and Mother Dead Through a Druggist's Mistake. George W. Bristol, general manager of the Metropolitan Mercantile Agency of New York, and his wife, have been stopping at the St. Nicholas hotel, in Corry, Pa. On January 15 his wife gave birth to a child, and seemed to be getting along finely, when, on the 18th inst., she became very ill and died at midnight.

Dr. M. Pickett had left a prescription for three grain capsules of quinine. Mr. Bristol had obtained twelve capsules less a few days before from a Randolph (N. Y.) druggist of the same medicine, and, instead of sending out for the Pickett prescription, gave his wife the Randolph capsules. She was very sick all day after taking the drug, vomiting often until she died. It now turns out that the Randolph capsules were three grains of morphia, instead of quinine. Mr. Bristol says he had been in the habit of getting three grain capsules, and of the same druggist, Dr. Blair analyzed one of the Randolph capsules, and found it to be morphia. Somebody made a mistake, and the life of the young wife paid the penalty.

Mr. Bristol says he had taken two of the capsules at different times, and had to resort to purgatives and emetics to get rid of their effects. His wife was the daughter of James Kinney, of Syracuse.
