

A DEMORALIZED PARTY.

THE AGONY OF THE REPUBLICANS.

Cat Fights in Nearly all the Wards—Boss
Bar Beats Boss McMcLean—The Conven-
vention Adjourns Without a
Nominee.

The Republicans of this city held their nominating meetings in all of the wards of the city between 6 and 8 o'clock last evening and the spirited contest called out a big vote and much bad blood was manifested. Wherever there was no chance to fight over a skirmish was had for delegates to the city convention to nominate candidates for mayor and school director.

The chief interest of the evening centred in the Third ward, where McMcLean made a savage attack on J. K. Barr, candidate for renomination for alderman. The polls were thronged at an early hour, and both sides had their gauge on hand. Neither labor nor money was spared to make votes. Men were brought home from long distances to the election, and cabs ran all evening. A number of knockdowns were had and many charges are freely made of bribery, corruption and illegal voting. The result was a majority of 54 for Barr in an unusually large vote, and when it was announced the joy of his friends at the overthrow of McMcLean was unbounded. H. C. Demuth, who can on the Barr ticket for select council, was also nominated, and Storch distanced his competitors for constable. Many of the Republican politicians outside of the ward exhibited practical contempt for the ward and its success was the occasion of much congratulation among most of those who assembled at the city convention. The friends of the tall chairman of the Third ward hide their shame.

In the first ward, after a sharp contest, Swenk beat Wagner for constable and Welches "got away" with Bradyamp for assessor. In the Fourth ward Andy Eicholtz "downd" Hen. Erismann for constable, and in the Fifth ward Winowar defeated Heiss; in the Sixth ward the politicians and bosses united to defeat D. G. Baker for select council and were successful in nominating the two and elected practical politicians outside of the ward.
