COUNTY OFFICIALS IN LIMBO.

Arrests for Alleged Insanity at the Es-
capee Prisoners.On Monday morning the Lancaster county
Commissioners, Glendorfer, Haines and
Van Sooy, Jail Warden Van Loos and
his deputy, W. Brittan, were arrested in
Wilkesbarre and taken before Alderman
Parsons, on a warrant issued at the in-
stance of G. D. L. O'Neill, in which they
are charged with unlawfully allowing
three persons—Daniel Sullivan, Ann
Sullivan and Michael S. to—depart from
custody, after being regularly sentenced
and committed by the court. It appears
that a good many years ago Daniel Sullivan
purchased a property from James Miller
and built thereon, paying Miller the whole
of the purchase money except \$40. O'Neill, some years afterwards, sued
Sullivan for other debts contracted by him
and procured judgment. After the case had been carried to the supreme
court executions were issued and the property
was sold at sheriff's sale and purchased
by O'Neill. Sullivan, however, refused to
give possession, and on the award of a
sheriff's jury O'Neill took forcible pos-
session. In the meantime Sullivan had made
a transfer of the property to Michael Sizzi,
a relative of his, who went to Miller,
paid the balance of the purchase money
and obtained a deed in his own name. A
few nights after O'Neill had taken posses-
sion, Sizzi and the Sullivan's sued for the
house, broke it open and took posses-
sion. They were arrested, tried, convicted
and sentenced to pay a fine of two dollars,
the costs, to make restitution of the prop-
erty and to stand committed until sentence
be complied with.

A sentence of this nature can be served
by remaining in prison thirty days, at the
expiration of which time, if all other re-
quirements have been complied with, the
fine is remitted, the county becomes liable
for the costs and the prisoners are dis-
charged. The three offenders remained in
jail the required number of days and then
appeared before the court and asked to be
discharged. As, however, they had not
made restitution of the property the court
refused to grant their discharge and re-
manded them to jail. Before returning to
prison, however, they went into the com-
missioners office and, promising to make
restitution, were given discharge and
set at liberty. After their discharge they
still refused to surrender possession of the
property and O'Neill, who is a lawyer, had
the officers arrested. Mr. O'Neill claims
that the commissioners have practically
taken upon themselves authority to release
the prisoners from compliance with that
part of the sentence requiring restitution,
over which they have no power, and, in
connection with the warden, have con-
nived at an unlawful escape. The case was
postponed until Monday morning. The
commissioners and wardens are held in
their own recognizance to appear. The
arrests created some excitement in Wilkes-
barre.
