COURT OFFICIALS IN LIMBO.

Arrested for Alleged Contumacy at the Escape of Prisoners.

On Monday morning the Luzerne county Commissioners Olenforter, Haines and Van Scoy, Jail Warden Van Loom and his deputy, W. Brittan, were arrested in Wilkesbarre and taken before Alderman Parsons, on a warrant issued at the instance of G. D. L. O'Neil, in which they are charged with unlawfully allowing these persons—Daniel Sullivan, Ann Sullivan and Michael S. ... to depart from custody, after being regularly sentenced and committed by the court. It appears that a good many years ago Daniel Sullivan purchased a property from James Miller and built thereon, paying Miller the whole of the purchase money, except \$40. O'Neil, some years afterwards, sued Sullivan for other debts contracted by him and procured judgment. After the case had been carried to the county court execution was issued and the property sold at sheriff's sale and purchased by O'Neil. Sullivan, however, refused to give possession, and on the award of a sheriff's jury O'Neil took forcible possession. In the meantime Sullivan had made a transfer of the property to Michael Sise, a relative of his, who went to Miller, paid the balance of the purchase money and obtained a deed in his own name. A few nights after O'Neil had taken possession, Sise and the Sullivans returned to the house, broke it open and took possession. They were arrested, tried, convicted and sentenced to pay a fine of two dollars, the costs, to make restitution of the property and to stand committed until sentence be complied with.

A sentence of this nature can be served by remaining in prison thirty days, at the expiration of which time, if all other requirements have been complied with, the fine is remitted, the county becomes liable for the costs and the prisoners are discharged. The three offenders remained in jail the required number of days and then appeared before the court and asked to be discharged. As, however, they had not made restitution of the property the court refused to grant their discharge and remanded them to jail. Before returning to prison, however, they went into the commissioners' office and, promising to make restitution, were given a discharge and set at liberty. After their discharge they still refused to surrender possession of the property and O'Neil, who is a lawyer, had the officers arrested. Mr. O'Neil claims that the commissioners have practically taken upon themselves authority to release the prisoners from compliance with that part of the sentence requiring restitution, over which they have no power, and, in connection with the warden, have contrived an unlawful escape. The case was postponed until Monday morning. The commissioners and warden are held in their own recognizance to appear. The arrests created some excitement in Wilkesbarre.
