Transportation For Live Stock.

Transportation For Live BLOCK. In 1875 the committee on agriculture of the House of Representatives, after care ful consideration reported as follows : "In 1872 one million head of eattle were received in New York, Philadelphia, Albany, Washington, Boston, Baltimore and Providence. Calculating the shrink-age in the common mode of transportation of ten per cent., there was a sum total of one hundred and twenty million pounds of beof starved, crushed, goaded and jolted one hundred and twenty million pounds of beof starved, crushed, goaded and jolted out of the cattle brought to the above named seven cities in a single year. If the shrinkage reached the total of 8,000,000 in 1872, it must now be fully 16,000,000. The committee said, and exence has shown, that three-fourths of this can be saved by the use of a proper car. Why should the "Eveners" refsue to save it or to let the railroads save it ? Why do they insist upon inflicting this dead loss upon the public when it is no gain to them? We can understand why they should persist in exacting their own tribute of \$5,000,000 per annum upon the food of the people, but we cannot under-stand why they should desire to sink \$16,000,000 more, nor what particular gratification it can be to them to poison the unconscious consumer with bad meat.

Killed While Bitting by the Fire.

Thursday night a cold-blooded murder was committed in Green county, Tenn. The wife of James Hunter was shot and instantly killed by some person who fired from the outside of the house. Hunter and his wife and other members of the family were sitting around the fire when a gun was fired through a window, three bullets passing through Mrs. Hunter's head. It is supposed that the murderers intended to kill Mr. Hunter, but the wife, in rocking to and fro, received the shot intended for her husband. Mr. Hunter is a wealthy farmer and had just received a large amount of money. Two brothers named Moore, who are suspected of the murder, were captured below Greenville coming toward Knoxville. They had a rifle carrying the same sized bullet as was found in Mrs. Hunter's brain, and their footprints correspond with those found near Mr. Hunter's window.

Five Lives Lost in a Skiff.
