SAVED BY PRAYER.

How a Causdian Minister Prayed Against Time on the Scaffold and Averted a Donbie Execution.

Richard Carr, who died recently in Canada, aged 80, was once sentenced to be hanged and Dr. Clark, of Erie, thus tells how he escaped.

"His ariest, conviction, sentence and escape are events closely connected with family and my childhood, my uncle, my 'amily and my childhood, my uncle, my 'n Ryerson, being the clergyman Rev. Jon. Carr to the scaffold, and who prayed against time for the purpose of cheating the hangman. He succeeded, and this is how it all happened. I was a child at the time and it happened at Victoria Caradian village itsat across the child at the time and it happened at Vic-toria, a Canadian village just across the lake, about 55 years ago. Who did Carr kill? No one. He was a quiet and in-offensive young man and so was his accomplice, Sm th, condemned to die with him. The affair formed the theme for many atrocious ballads by numerous vil-

lage poets. ria into a ferment. Suspicion fell upon Carr, and the village Dogberries succeeded in wringing confessions from Carr and Smith. Their trial and conviction speedily followed and the sentence was death. I belive the wretched doggerel that was sung when I was a child was inspired by just such trials as this one. In one of asks a ballads, I remember, the condemned asks a ballads, I remember, the condemned asks a favor of the judge, which is answered after this fashion :

All right, said the judge,
Then away you may truege
Off back to your cell,
And to morrow moru,
Just as sure as you were born,
On the bough of an oak you swing.

Tes, you shall croak,
On the bough of an oak.
And I'm sorry to see such a glutton
But you've had your fill,
Those lambs you did kill,

And dearly must you pay for your mutton. "Among those who were horrified and shocked at the approaching execution were my uncle, the spiritual adviser of the poor fellows, and Dr. John Rolf, whose memory still clings to the village. Rev. John Ryerson was a brother to Dr. Egerton Ryerson, D. D., superintendent of elucation in Ontario, and who died two years ago, the Houses of Parliament adjourning to attend the funeral.

" Dr. Rolf was more excited than any of Smith and Carr's sympathisers, and be determined to ride to Toronto and intercede with the governor, who I think was Sir John Colborn. Before departing on his hazardous errand of mercy, Dr. Rolf was closeted with my uncle, Rev. John Ryerson. The latter subsequently told me that he had agreed to delay the hang ing all he could by making the closing prayer as long as his strength and power of utterance would permit, provided that Rolf had not returned. Good Dr. Rolf calculated upon getting back a few hours before the time set for the execu-

"The gallows was erected in the open air. Smith and Carr were placed in position and when the bangman's little preliminaries were over the sheriff was informed that all was ready for the son's flual blessing or prayer. The Rev. Ryerson got down on his knees and began the longest and most remarkable prayer on record. An hour passed and he was still on his knees. There was now no relevancy to h s appeal. He morely uttered words to consume time. He told me later that he did not know what he was saying, and that the only real prayer uttered in all that time was a silent one and composed of four words, 'God hasten Rolf's footsteps.' At the end of an hour and a half there was quite an uproar, and the discontent had almost become a riot, when a voice called, 'Here comes Dr. Rolf.' My uncle did not hear or heed the new tumult that now arose, but prayed or, becoming weaker each minute. Soon the horseman approached near enough to be recognized and the doctor dashed up to the foot of the scaffold. He was too weak to speak or move, but a man in the crowd spatched a document from his hand and mounting on the back of the horse shouted, 'Reprieve, reprieve !' It was so, and that is how Carr and Smith were saved."
