A YOUNG MAN'S FALL, Stealing a Diamond Pin He is Lodged in Jail.

Wm. H. Schuerer, a young man who moved in the best society in the city, is confined in one of the ordinary cells in Annapolis jail, charged with entering the room of Lieut. Austin M. Knight, while he was on duty at the naval experimental battery, and stealing a diamond scarf pin which he pawned to a dealer in Baltimore Lieut.
