State Political Points.

Field Marshal Cooper is for Blaine.

The Venango county Democratic convention has elected three Randall delegates to the state convention. Tariff resolutions were offered and rejected.

The Republican legislative conventions were held in Wilkesbarre yesterday. In all the districts some delegates were elected to the legislature, passed by the Senate, Blaine and Lincoln at Chicago.

The Blaine men of Harrisburg have determined to hold a public meeting in the court house on Thursday evening, when Francis Jordan will make a speech in favor of Blaine for president.

The Democrats of Lehigh county talk of adopting the Crawford county system in their nominations for county offices.

The sub committee of twenty-one, appointed for the purpose of discussing the advisability of disbanding the One Hundred in Philadelphia, have passed the discussion of the matter until next Tuesday, when the entire committee will be invited to present.

The Republicans of the Lackawanna county end of the Twelfth congressional district held their convention in Scranton yesterday. Colonel H. M. Boiss, of Scranton, was chosen delegate to the national convention and instructed to vote for Blaine and Lincoln.
