the County. Trade has been very active during the last week in our local market, both in old and new tobaccos. Of the former several hundred cases were sold in lots averaging 100 cases each, and there are rumors of several other heavy transactions, the particulars of which are not attainable. Several well known New York buyers are here inquiring for old packings.

Recent Purchases In

Great activity continues to pravail among buyers of new tobacco. So rapidly has the buying been going on in some parts of the county that the crop is almost entirely lifted. Among well informed parties it is thought that fully four fifths of the whole crop has been taken, while some even place the amount in the hands of the growers as less than one-fifth. Prices have advanced somewhat, prime wrappers selling as high as 25c., while inferior goods have been sold for 8. Should the "boom" continue for two weeks longer, the entire crop of '83 will be in the hands of the packers. Every day there are large deliveries at the city warehouses, which at this time are busy hives of industry, giving profitable employment to an army of men and boys.

Very little is yet doing by the farmers for the crop of '94 Many of them have sown their seed, and some have plants sprouting, but the season has been so yet prepared, nor all the oats sown. It wil be some weeks yet before any tobacco planting is done Below we publish a few of the many
