A RECTOR'S RESIGNATION. Rev. C. N. Spalding, of St. John's Free Church, Calaca to Other Fields of Labor.

Rev. C. N. Spalding, rector of St. John's Free church, at a special meeting of the vestry, held last evening, tendered his resignation, to take effect on the 30th of June. He has accepted a call to a new field of labor, involving an important educational work in the diocese of Indiana, for which he is peculiarly qualified, not only by education, but by previous training as a teacher.

The vestry in accepting his resignation, unanimously adopted a minute bearing testimony to the zeal of Mr. Spalding, "as manifested in the work of the church during the three years he has ministered to the parish of St. John's, and especially his ability and earnestness with which he has preached the gospel of our blessed Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ and him crucified," and that "in consenting to sever the pastoral relation they extend their best wishes for the future prosperity of himself and family, and pray that God's choicest blessing may rest upon his labors in the new field to which he has been called."

Rev. Spalding since his severe and protracted illness last fall and winter has felt the need of rest, and it was with relief amid the exhausting labors of parish work, and the necessity of a more extended vacation than usual this summer is mentioned in his letter of resignation as the reason for not giving longer notice of his purpose.

Chester County Commissioners. Joseph T. Reynolds, Walter McFeat and Wellington C. Jones, commissioners of Chester county, on Monday last, presented to submit to the commissioners of this county the plans and specifications of an inter-county bridge, which is to be made at Ross' Fording. The plans will no doubt be agreed upon by both boards. The viaduct was stopped at the Stevens house, and were shown around the city by the officials here.
