CHARLES FENAU MOFFMAN.

Death of a Famous Post and Writer of the A modest announcement of the death at Harrisburg on Saturday of Charles Found Hoffman recalls a name that once held a Hoffman recalls a name that once held a conspicuous place in American literature and which is still held in high regard by reading people, though the man who bore it had long since passed from the scenes of active life. The career of Charles Fenno Hoffman really dates back quite half a century. He was one of the well known New York family, a son of Judge Josiah O. Hoffman and a brother of Ogden Hoffman, and was born in New York city in 1806. He was graduated at Columbia college and admitted to the bar at twentyone, but literature had more attractions college and admitted to the bar at twentyone, but literature had more attractions
for him than the law and in 1833 he
established the Kniekerbocker Magazine,
which afterward became so famous. He
relinquished the Kniekerbocker after a few
months to Flint and took charge of the
American Monthly Magazine, which had
been established by Henry William
Herbert. Of this he was chief editor for
many years, also editing at the same time
the New York Mirror. In 1835 he published "A Winter in the West," a series of
sketches of nature and of men that had
much to commend them. This book was
followed by "Wild Scenes in Forest and
Prairie," first published in London, and
by "Greyslaer," a romance founded on
the trial of Beauchamp for the murder of
Colonel Sharper, of Kentucky, that met
with great success. It is by his poems,
however, that Hoffman is best remembered, and the several volumes, "The Vigit ed, and the several volumes, "The Vigil of Faith," "Lays of the Hudson," "Love" Calendar," etc., are prized by collectors of American books. He had a natural feeling for the poetry of American landscape and had cultivated the refined and graceful style of the Knickerbocker school. In purely tyric poetry he was more successful than any of his compeers, though his manner was a little too close to that of Tom Moore to escape the charge of imitation. Such songs as "Rosalie Clare," "Tis Hard to Share Her Smiles With Many," "Sparkling and Bright," and "The Myrtle and Steel" have not yet lost all their popularity and it is sad to think that the mind which gave the world these bright and graceful lyrics has been for many years bereft of light.
