In council last evening, every member present, the minutes were read and approved, since last month of \$68,968 49, expenditures, \$65,500, balance, \$3,468 25.

The request of the Columbia Fire company to be allowed to put their steam engine on the street, at the corner of Second and Third streets, was referred to the fire committee with power to act.
