NOTES OF EUROPEAN TRAVEL.

How some Laucaster Countiess Crossed the Ocean-Their Arrival in Ireland-First Impression of Cork. Extracts From Private Correspondence.

STRAMER ACRANIA, LATITUDE, 47-36', / LONGITUDE, 23' D', MONDAY, June 9, 1881. We got off from the Canard steamship wharves New York on Wednesday, the 4th at 2j p. m. Slowly the little steam tug pulled the ship out into the stream, when she swung around and gallantly steamed down the bay of New York. The Battery, Governor's Island, the fortifications on Long Island, and Staten Island are soon passed. At Saudy Hook our pilot left us, and soon we were out on the broad Atlautic and by sundown the last vestige of land had disappeared. We have a large list of passengers, nearly 500 in number, among them Rev. Morgan Dix, D. D., rector of Trinity church N. To magnify an unforeseen direumstance in the life of the late Thaddens Stevens, into a great historical fact, and attach to it honors to its hero, such as were never given to Casar-was, to say the least, an oratorical license on the part of our friend Col. for the Republican primary election. He had no competitor for renomination. Lancaster county had then as now the Crawford county system of nominating, one of its well known features being to print the names of all the candidates for the respective offices on a slip of paper, which the voter can readily change to a ticket or ballot simply by striking off the names of those he does not wish to vote. At the time of Mr. Stevens' death, those slips had not only been prepared, but all, at least the greater portion had already been sent out, either by the committee, or by the more active agency of the contest-ing candidates. Mr. Stevens' name was of course on the slip for Congress, for even f his death, at that particular juncture
