No Change to the Sumatra Tariff Law Prob-

It seems almost a certainty that there will be no change made by the present Congress in the law relating to the duty on Sumatra tobacco. Both Sepator Platt and Congressman Hewitt hold out no hope that anything can be dobe. It is likely that Congress will adjourn in two weeks, and there is no disposition evinced by that body to take up any matter relating to the tariff. A proposition to have the law in question changed would therefore not be entertained, as it would lead to a lengthy debate, which would drag in other matters relating to the tariff. Those who so strongly desire to have the law changed will consequently have to possess

their souls in patience until Congress again meets in March next. Uniy Two Respects. "' In two respects only,' says the ways and means committee report on the Mexican treaty, ' would there seem to be any

interference with any productive industry

carried on in this country. "It has been feared that the sugar in dustry of Louisiana might be unfavorably effected by the free admission of raw Mexican sugars, and that the profits of tobacco culture might ultimately in some way be affected.

"No serious injury can reasonably be anticipated as to either of these interests. when it is considered that the total amount of sugar imported from Mexico during the last six years was 1,793,171 pounds, valued at \$63,419, and of tobacco 31,309 pounds, valued at \$20,651. It is, moreover, conceded that Mexico at present does not raise sufficient sugar for its own use, and that its tobacco is of a quality which does not interfere with the product of the United States, but, on the contrary, would advantageously supplement it and replace the tobacco which is now imported from the Island of Cuba. The objection, therefore, arises rather from the apprehension in the development of Mexico in the pro-
