One of our correspondents has figured up the cost of keeping dogs in his state, and finds that they eat enough annually to feed 100,000 workmen, and counting in the damages they do the sheep farmers, the dogs cost the state \$3,000,000, while the education of all the children in the state is less than half that sum.

A Tennessee man makes out a similar condition of affairs in his state. He finds there are 300,000 worthless dogs, which consume as good enough if fed to dogs to make 30,000,000 pounds of bacon, which would be equal to feeding meat to 100,000 able bodied men a whole year. At ten cents per pound the bacon would be worth \$3,000,000, and if in silver would land down 30,000,000 dollars.

Another writer, after making careful estimates of the damage done by dogs in the Northern states alone, finds it costs not less than \$35,000,000 annually to support dogs; a sum that would buy 175,000 farms at government prices for land, or it would purchase 132,000 neighborhood libraries of 300 volumes each.
