THE CREMATIONIST.

To Proceed With the Erection of a Furnace.
The Lancaster Cremation society held a meeting last night at the office of H. C. Brubaker esq.

The committee appointed to select a site for the furnace reported that they had purchased 2½ acres of land from John J. Evans, on Morton avenue, in the lower part of the city. The purchase was approved, and the committee was instructed to at once obtain plans, &c., and proceed with the work of building.

Dr. M. L. Davis, who has just returned from a visit to the furnace at Washington, Pa., gave a long and interesting account of what he had seen and learned concerning the working of the furnace, substantially as told by Mr. Geo. R. Reed, in recent INTELLIGENCER interview.

The furnace selected for the present is very eligible, being situated on a level hill cemetery and on a high bluff overlooking the Conestoga creek, the grounds sloping down to the water's edge. They will be handsomely fitted up and the place made attractive.

The Latest Necrology at Washington.

John M. Howe died of consumption at his home in New York on June 27, and his remains were incinerated in the Le Moyne crematory, Washington, Monday. He was about thirty years of age and engaged to marry a Miss Nulty, whose father accompanied the body to the place.

KIDS OVER AND KILLED.

Death of a Well Known Harford County Stage Driver.

William Anderson, driver of the mail stage plying between Belair and Edgewood, Baltimore, Philadelphia, Wilmington and Baltimore railroad, was accidentally killed at Edgewood Monday. While delivering the mail, the postmaster of the office about 7 o'clock, his horse started to run. Mr. Anderson went out, and, seizing the lines to stop them, was dashed violently to the ground, the heavy stage passing over his head. He was taken up unconscious, and Drs. Billingsley and Mumfords found that his skull was fractured. He died at three o'clock. His remains were brought to his home in Belair this afternoon. Mr. Anderson had been driver and proprietor of stages in Harford county for nearly forty years, and was well known in Old Town, Baltimore, and along the line of the Harford turnpikes over which he drove a tri weekly stage to Baltimore for many years. He was greatly respected as an honest man and good, useful citizen. He was a native of Chester county, Pa., and was about sixty seven years of age. He leaves a wife, six sons and two daughters.
