A FOREIGN VIEW.

HOW AMERICAN GIRLS ARE IN LONDON.

Child in Dispute at a Baptism.

A public baptism by immersion took place in the river fronting the Watervliet Arsenal grounds. A concourse of people, several thousands in number, were interested spectators of the ceremonies and of the scene which followed. The subject for baptism was a colored girl. While the ceremony was being proceeded with, Daniel Knorr, who had been appointed guardian of the daughter of a Mrs. Canlins, widow of Theodor Canlins, came on the ground, and acting under the advice of his lawyer, attempted to take the child by force. This proceeding acted as an irritant on the temper of the arms of the child, and the result was that a hue and cry was raised by them which set George Canlins in motion. Mr. Canlins, who is a brother of the child's aunt, grasped the child by one arm, while Daniel Knorr tagged vigorously the other, each striving to obtain possession of the child. At this juncture Officer Parling appeared on the scene and used his authority to prevent the child from being the innocent object of violence. The officer's persuasive powers resulted in the girl's release. This was no sooner effected than one aunt, who had all the while been watching her opportunity, grasped the child and ran off with her, leaving Knorr and Canlins still struggling in the water. The girl's injuries, although not very dangerous, are painful.

San Death of Two Young Ladies.

Miss Charlotte Williams and Miss Sue Gibson, each about 15 years of age, were drowned Monday at Old Point while bathing. From modest impulses and desiring to be out of the crowd of bathers they went some distance below the hotel and below the regular bathing place. Some gentlemen in the vicinity chanced to see them in the water, and were unable to tell whether they were male or female. As the bathers appeared to be in distress the parties rushed down the beach, but arrived too late, as both sank before their bodies could be reached. Miss Williams' body was recovered about noon, and that of Miss Gibson about an hour later. Both were popular and pretty girls, and had been in the water about a week. They were first cousins, and were the daughters of Mr. John L. Williams and Mr. P. R. Gibson, well known brokers in Richmond, under the firm name of Williams & Gibson. Miss Williams was a niece of Major R. A. Williams, so long connected with the Baltimore press. Their bodies will be brought home. They were members of the same church and the same Sunday school class. The affair has cast a gloom over Old Point.
