A sensation in the town—Solecism, Accident or Murder—The Mysterious Fate of William Bentley—Night of Accident?

Was it murder, accident or accident? It is a question that has been on every street in Columbia this morning, when the news spread abroad that Charles Bentley had been fatally shot about 12:15 this a. m. The question is a difficult one to answer, and it is not so mysterious as it seems.

About 8 o'clock last evening, Charles Bentley, Henry Optum, George Fry and Emanuel Bardenheiser, all boatmen, whose boats lie at the Second street wharf, after finishing their work, were out on a racket. They first visited Mary Metzall on North Front street, where they indulged in some high "carrying on." They made so much noise that Mary was forced to go to her room and attend to her hair.

Bentley did not want to leave, but flourished a revolver, and expressed a desire to meet the policeman. On his way to his boat, he attempted to quarrel with Optum, and several times drew his revolver, and threatened to shoot. At a stable near the coal chute he carried his threat into effect, and fired his revolver. Optum says it was aimed at him, but luckily it missed its mark. After much wrangling between themselves the party arrived at the boat, where Optum left him going to the Sunnyside, which boat he is captain of.

Whether the third round shot or the first round shot was the fatal one is not known, but it is believed that Bentley was struck in the chest, and fell overboard. He was tenderly cared for, while his three companions started in search of a doctor.

At Front and Lehigh streets they met officers Witt and Galt. Bentley was followed them, but dared not arrest them while in the boats, having no warrants. They accompanied the party to Third street, where, being near the coal chute, they arrested and placed Bentley in the boat.

The boatmen who took Dr. Borthwick and visited the boat, where they found Bentley suffering intensely. The wound, which is in the lower part of the abdomen, was probed, but the bullet could not be found. Another attempt was made to make this morning, but it also was unsuccessful. Dr. Borthwick thinks the bullet has lodged in the bladder, as the results of both probedings show its course to be towards that part of the body.
