THE ELECTRICAL EXHIBITION.

A Glance at a Few of the Prominent Features of the Coming Event.

Since the enlargement of the balcony extending round the nave of the Main Exhibition building, applications enough have been received to indicate that a large portion of the space thus gained will be taken up by exhibits. The east end, however, is reserved for a large Roosevelt organ, to be played by electricity from a keyboard near the fountain. A fund is being raised for the purchase of such rare books as are not in the Franklin Institute, as it is proposed to make the literature of the subject complete. The books, after the exhibition closes, will be added to the Institute library as a memorial.

A very interesting museum of relics will form an important part of the display. Franklin's electric machine, and the plates from the workshop of Professor Henry, patent office machine and the original Morse telegraph instrument, owned by the Smithsonian Institute, will be included in the collection with the earlier inventions of Gray, Bell, Edison and others. The building is to be lighted by the different companies in turn. Rooms dicated by board partitions will show the incandescent systems, the so-called "storage" batteries being exhibited in operation. The electroplating department and the naval display promise to prove highly attractive. The latter will include torpedo defenses and the enormous search light of 30,000 candle power for detecting torpedoes by lighting up deep water. The electric transmission of power is to be fully displayed. The electric light exhibits number only one, the Brush, Edison and United States companies being among the most liberal contributors.
