Drying Too Rapicly.

There is nothing of special interest to report in the local market. Some 200 or more cases of old leaf have changed hands during the week just ended, and about an equal quantity of '83 has been disposed of, the terms of sale being private. More than one-half of the packing of '83 has been sampled, and meets the expectation of the packers both as to the quality and color. It is confidently believed that as soon as its excellence becomes known among manufacturers and jobbers, it will find a ready sale. In appearance it almost equals Sumatra while in quality it is infinitely better.

The crop of '84 has all been housed and is drying rapidly—rather too rapidly, in-

The crop of '84 has all been housed and is drying rapidly—rather too rapidly, indeed, to please the farmers. The weather has been extremely warm and dry, and this hastens the curing of the leaf. It is conceded that the most favorable conditions for curing the weed are those in which the leaf cures slowly but regularly from the time it is placed upon the poles until it is fically taken down. These conditions can introduce the curing of the leaf.

The New York Market, From the Tobacco Journal,

Again the memories of the oldest inhabitanta of the leaf market have been brought into requisition for the discovery of a similar duliness in the leaf circles as existed this week. The "street" was deserted almost, and the faces of leaf merchants were signs of too free an indulation in funeral reminiscences. dulgence in funeral reminiscences. Theu came authenticated reports of a

number of rejections of 1883 Wisconsin Havana seed, and the cup of misery was full. In justice to holders of '83 Wiscon-sin Havana seed and in order to avoid making a wrong impression upon prospec tive buyers, it must be mentioned that in most cases, these rejections were simply due to the difference between packers' and stripped samples. It is the old story over again that selling by packers' sam-ples is a good thing for the buyer. If business is fair, if the goods turn out any way near packers' samples and there is a prospect of higher prices, the difference between the packers' and the stripped samples are treated in a somewhat fraternal spirit; but when the market is dull, when prices show no inclination for ascen dancy, and when the prospects are not too sunny, the seller by packers' samples sees trouble. The only fault the '80 Wisconsin Havana seed seems to have is that it is too dear; and, therefore, even an imaginary difference between the old and new samples serves the purpose and the goods are sent back. There is nothing unsound in the '83 Wisconsin Havana seed, but there is not a sufficient amount of wrappers in

They will buy Wisconsin Havana seed if it goes lower; they will buy state Havana seed, under about the same condition, provided the tobacco will be faulties in burning; they will buy the 183 Deanway wants at profits by the 183 Deanway wants at profits of the period. the '83 Pennsylvania at profitable prices to holders of good stock and at downright begging prices for poor stock. The same condition will prevail in '83 Connectiout. Ohio, the Cinderella of the market, will flow into the old channels. The few sales made during the week comprised one of 200 cases of '83 Pennsylvania at 14; cents, to a manufacturer. Several more
