TURBDAY EVENING, OUT, 98, 1884 VAUED IN A BURNING MINE.

Two Mem Taken Out Dead and Fifteen More Victims Probable.

An explosion of fire damp occurred in the mines of the Youngstown coke works, near Uniontown, Pa., Monday afternoon at 4 o'clock. The report was heard at the office, and on going to the mine, which is entered by a slope, the employes found the mines enveloped in flames. It was a half hour before they could get in the mine, finally going down through the air shaft. After desperate efforts they succeeded in getting out two dead bodies and rescaing four men alive.

The dead are Josephh Zebley, the pumper, 18 years old and unmarried, who was burned and crushed almost beyond recognition, and Jack Lape, the roperider, who was suffocuted by the after damp. He was 30 years old, and leaves a widow and two children. Of the four survivors—Jacob Cole, David Cole, Washington Keffer and a boy named Chauncey—the first two are badly burned and may not live.

All further efforts to enter the burning mine were fruitless, and as there are about fifteen men penned up it is supposed that they will all perish. The excitement is great about the mine, and the agony of wives and children as they bewail the fate of their husbands and fathers in the burning pit is heartrending. Many have gone to the scene of disaster, but it is feared that the unfortunate men will not be recued, dead or alive, before morning. The mine is owned by parties in Youngstown and the Mahoning Valley, Ohio.
