The Long Count of the Vote at Last Completed. NEW YORK'S PLURALITY IS 1,147. The Republican effort to stifle the voice of the People of the Empire State ends in a miserable fiasco—Result of the Count in New York City.

New York, Nov. 15.—The board of supervisors resumed the canvass of New York county to-day. The Fifteenth Assembly district was completed without material change from the original count. In one of the election districts of the Sixteenth Assembly district a slight error was discovered and the vote of the district was referred to the committee on corrected returns, otherwise there was no material change.

After the completion of the Seventeenth Assembly district the first election district of the Eighteenth Assembly district was objected to because the total number of votes as read was 193, whereas it was claimed 225 were cast, and that the Republican electors received 81 votes instead of 54, as recorded. This election district was therefore referred to the committee on corrected returns. The count then went on to the twenty-first election district of the Eighteenth Assembly district which has been reached without the discovery of any other errors.

Pluralities, Monroe county, Blaine, 5,076. [This is the same as heretofore reported.] The Seventeenth Assembly district, Cleveland, 1,130; Eighteenth Assembly district, Cleveland, 3,468; Nineteenth Assembly district, Cleveland, 2,000. The Nineteenth and Twentieth Assembly districts were completed without objections or incident. It was resolved to request the committee on corrected returns to give the preference to the electoral ticket.

In the Twenty-first Assembly district, five defective ballots and four blanks were found, but no objections or changes were made. The board of canvassers' count on the presidential vote in the First Assembly district complete gives Cleveland, 1,983; Fifteenth Assembly district complete, Cleveland, 2,274; Sixteenth Assembly district, Cleveland, 2,601; Twenty-second Assembly district was canvassed without change. There were ten defective and seven blank votes; Twenty-third Assembly district was canvassed without change.

THE AGENT OVER. 2 p. m.—A hasty computation by the clerk in charge of the city returns, of which the canvass has just been completed, leads him to state that the plurality for Cleveland in the entire state will be 1,147. He figures that Blaine made a net gain in the city of 120 votes. An Election Front in Oregon. PORTLAND, Oregon, Nov. 15.—A dispatch was received last night from Harington, the county seat of Lincoln county, which states that forty armed men are guarding the court house there and will not permit the records to be removed until the alleged election frauds are investigated. Trouble is feared.

A Great Success. PETERSBURG, Va., Nov. 15.—At an early hour this morning, three warehouses on Low street, owned by J. M. Williams, an extensive sumac dealer, in which were stored 1,300,000 pounds of sumac, were destroyed by fire, causing a loss of \$15,000; insured. The fire was of incendiary origin. Trying to Draw Out of a Hole. WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—The court adjourned to try the charges against Judge Andrews on General S' main convenes here to-day.
