REPUBLICAN VOTE OF PENNSYLVANIA.
The Count Concluded—The Number of Votes Cast for the Highest and Lowest Candidates, each Party.

HARRISBURG, Nov. 22.—The count of the electoral vote in this state was concluded early this morning. On the Republican electoral ticket Edwin S. Stewart received the highest vote, 474,293. A minority in the tickets circulated in McKeen county makes H. F. Conlin the high set on that ticket with 471,004 votes.
