THE "SPOILS SYSTEM."

A Practice That Was Started by the Rank Old

From Chauncey F. Black's Letter to the Pitts burg Democratic Banquet.
The dangers which some men—for the most part men of Federalist breeding—think they see before a Democratic administration, seem to me very unreal. Democracy means means simplicity, economy, no jobbery, no monopoly, revenue sufficient to support the government, confined to constitutional object, and the rigid application of public monies to these objects, and these only. We are unquestionably going to have reform in the civil service. We are to have it there, as everywhere else, because a Democrat will be president. That reform will be effected by the new accession of an honest and

If this were all it might be borne; but they mingle with their groans such atrocious lies upon Jefferson and Jackson, and so complacently warn our new presiagainst those illustrious that they deceive the As a matter of fact Jackson his was not a spoils administration. Fully one-half of the men in office under Jackson were his political enemies, and under Jefferson the proportion was much greater. When the Federalists went out in 1801 they had every office stuffed with their own creatures and they continued the stuffing process down to the night before the inanguration. And more than half these were spared—monuments of bemocratic tolerance—the great apostle of Democracy Insisting only that the majority of the country should be given a moderate representation!

Again the people, under circumstances nearly similar, declare that the Federalists shall go, and Grover Cleveland is appointed were his political enemies, and under Jeffernearly similar, declare that the Federalists shall go, and Grover Cleveland is appointed to execute the judgment. Now when these Federalist Republicans, who proudly trace their political lineage to Hamilton, the first and greatest of spellsmen, who have been intrenched in office for a quarter of a century and no more thought of admitting Democrats to a share than if the latter had been public enemies. When they abuse Jefferson and Jackson are we to understand that they demand larger toleration from President Cleveland than their kind, received from those of his predecessors whose names are highest on land than their kind received from those of his predecessors whose names are highest on the calendar of Domocratic saints? If so they will probably be disappointed. The man who made that Newark speech will come about as near to the standard of Jefferson as the alterations of time and circumstances will permit.
