### A MILLIONAIRE CONVICT.

Milton Weston, the Chicago Capitalist, Sen-  
tenced to Five Year Imprisonment.

Milton Weston, the millionaire Chicago  
capitalist, who was convicted of complicity in  
the riots of the Murrysville gas well, eight  
months ago, when Superintendent  
Haymaker, of the Pennsylvania fuel com-  
pany, met his death, was brought into the  
Pittsburg court on Saturday to hear Judge  
Bailey's decision on the application for a new  
trial. The court stated briefly that he had  
considered the case fully and was convinced  
that he should not be retried. Before  
sentence was passed Mr. Weston's counsel  
read letters from several prominent gentle-  
men in Chicago and New York, one of them  
a judge, commending the prisoner as a man  
of excellent character. Weston had nothing  
to say himself but he was sentenced, simply  
stating that his counsel had expressed their  
self for him. The court then imposed a  
sentence of five years to the penitentiary.

Mr. Weston received the sentence with a  
remarkable composure and followed a deputy  
sheriff quietly from the room afterwards. He  
was taken to the penitentiary, but as the case  
goes to the supreme court an application was  
made to one of the judges of that court  
to have him admitted to bail pending  
the disposition of the case. Michael Haymaker,  
brother of the man who was killed, was  
present. The riots, it will be remembered,  
were the result of a dispute as to the own-  
ership of the big gas well at Murrysville.  
Haymaker's party had possession and the  
Weston party attempted to oust them and  
the riot followed.

### AT HOME AND ABROAD.

Late News Items, in Condensed Form. Part of  
Material Interest.

Three noted British naval officers have  
been sent to the Baltic sea to report suitable  
moorings for a British fleet in the event of  
war between England and Russia.

A boarding house run by a Mrs. McIntyre,  
in Appleton, Wis., was found by a crazy  
woman. Twenty boarders barely escaped with  
their lives, losing all their clothes and prop-  
erty.

Jack Clark shot and killed his father, Joe  
Clark, at Manchester, Ky. The two had a  
friendly dispute about the house and the son  
went to his father's house and shot him without  
warning. The murderer has not been arrested  
yet.

By the end of April the Russian authori-  
ties will have at least 55 first-class men-of-  
war, all armor-plated, six of them being  
heavy iron-clads, after the pattern of the  
Peter the Great, and 100 torpedo boats, and  
rams, ready at Cronstadt for active ser-  
vice.

The Chinese viceroy of the provinces of  
Yunnan and Kweichow issued a decree  
ordering the destruction of all Catholic con-  
vents and the killing of all Catholic converts  
and foreigners. As a result of this decree  
several of the condemned convents have  
been razed and several hundred Catholic  
converts and foreigners assassinated.

She Wedded Sixteen Years.

Frank M. Roberts, of the Jerseyville, Ill.,  
Republican-Examiner, has just been mar-  
ried to Miss Clara Bullington, music teacher.

The bride and groom were betrothed sixteen  
years ago, but owing to opposition by the  
bride's parents, the nuptials were not celebra-  
ted, and separating, she knew nothing of  
his whereabouts for thirteen years. In 1872  
he married another lady in Humboldt, Kan.  
In 1882 she died in Sigourney, Ia., exacting  
from her husband a promise that if he mar-  
ried again it should be his first love, if pos-  
sible. Subsequently, writing from Mexico,  
he found his present wife unmarried, and  
the sequel indicates her fidelity.
