"OLD HANNAH!"

The First Pennsylvania R. R. Engine Doing Duty Near Wilkinsburg. From the Pittsburg Telegraph.

Running on the little branch road from the Pennsylvania at Edgewood station up to the mines of the Hampton coal company, above Wilkinsburg, is probably the oldest engine now in use in the country. Up to within three or four years "Old Hannah, as she is called, was in active use on the main line of the road. For over a quarter of a century the old engine passed and repassed, hundreds of times, to and fro between Pitts burg and Philadelphia.

"Old Hannah" was built at the Baldwin locomotive works in 1851, and was the first of its kind ever built in this country. The number on her front is No. 1. In her day, before the great improvements on lecomo tives were brought out, she was considered a wonderful engine-and she was, too. Strong, well built, and with powers of great speed, "Old Hannah" had matters pretty much her own way on the road. As she was the oldest, the other locomotives kind of laid back out the other locomotives kind of laid back out of the way when she came dashing along. They showed her great respect. But it was during the stirring times of the war that "Old Hannah" made for herself her great reputation. Tom Lacock, the engineer now in charge of the old veteran, is well acquainted with her history. "During the war," he said yesterday, "Old Hannah" tugged more soldiers through to Philadelphia than any two engines on the road. She was running solders directly to remain than any two engines on the road. She was running specially on this line of duty. I knew her engineer, and I think he was prouder of his engine than any man I ever knew. For twenty-nine years he held the lever of 'Old Hannah,' and she never got ugly, or refused to do her work. She was a model in her be-havior. I never heard of her wrecking a train or smashing up anything.

WHAT THE ENGINE IS DOING NOW. "How does she work now?" "Well, just come and look at her. She looks kind of shaky like, and she isn't as pretty as some engines they are turning out now, but you ought to see her yank out a train of coal cars. She hasn't forgotten how to pull, not a bit of it. But she is almost ne out. Her flues and tires are abou for, and we can't get them in good shape. After an engine has been at work 35 years, almost, you would expect something to give out. She is just like an old man—plays out all over and you can't doctor him up to what he was when he was young. No, 'Old Hannah' will never go out on the main line again, but she does the work here well enough, and but she does the work here well enough, and that is all we want. We will take good care of her," and he looked admiringly at the old

engine.
There is hardly an engineer on the road that does not know "Old Hannah." No. 1 is more familiar to them than some of the engines where the numbers run up into the hundreds. No. 1 is held in a sort of venera-tion, which is her right, indeed, by virtue of her age and long years of usefulness.

A Pack of Cards Well Earned From the New York Sun.

"Why do you pick that up?" asked a reporter of a man who had just stooped down and taken a fugitive nine of clubs out of the mud. He was carefully cleaning the card with his pocket handkerchief. " It's a habit I have contracted," he said,
