THE NEW SOUTHERN EVANGELIST. The Secret of Rough Sam Jones' Power to

Convert Sinners.
From the New York Tribune.

The Rev. Sam Jones, who has been known in the South for some time as a successful evangelist, has been creating a genuine sensation in several Southern cities during the last few months. His success in starting revivals of religion has, from all accounts, been phenomenal. As many as 8,000 people of all grades in society have frequently met to hear him, and every one has literally hung on the burning words of Sam Jones, as he is familiarly called throughout the South. The secret of the man's success appears to be first of all his intense earnestness. He is deeply penetrated with the reality of the gospel which he preaches. He feels irresistibly compelled to preach by a divine command. His style is homely, direct and simple. Arguments he eschews, but he is rich in illustra tions and his sermons are filled with epi grams and quick flashes of biting wit. Sometimes his hearers laugh at a bizarre bit of humor, and sometimes they weep at a stirring appeal to their emotions. He is not a man of much education, and for this reason is looked upon with suspicion at first by the regular clergy, but he soon carries all preju-dices before him. In the words of the Nash-"Such is Sam Jones, bold, honest, earn-

est; matchless in his command of an audience, fearing God, but not man; loving religion and law, but despising the affected wisdom of men and the conventionalities of fashionable society; rough, but magnanimous; aggressive, but unselfish; devout, but not Pharisaid a bubbling fount force. not Pharisaical—a bubbling fount fresh from the bosom of the earth; nature's own, without the artificial gloss of a high cultivation—a sort of moral diamond in the rough." His epigrammatic utterances—sometimes
