THE CREMATORIUM AT MILAN.

A Furnace that Incinerates Eighteen or Twenty

From the London World. The crematorium stands at the far end o the grounds, a building not large nor high, but, with its crescent-shaped open atrium of white marble, subiciently handsome and imposing. On the frieze is this description: l'empio Crematorio per volontadel Alberte Keller eretto e donalo alla citta di Milano. On the wall facing the entrance is a hand some medallion of Albert Keller, who was duly cremated in the temple of his own providing. Many portions of the wall are marked off in smalll tablets inscribed with the names of the persons whose bodies have undergone cremation, and whose ashes, in many cases, reposed in an urn or small vessel in a niche behind the tablet. Ashes they are not, properly speaking. I was shown about a couple of handfuls of white bleached bone, in bits no longer than one's tinger-all that remained, as I learned, after the cremation of the body of a man some ten stone in weight. Other spaces have been appropriated by intending cremators, and have the word "Assegnato" inscribed on them. Through a small door you pass from the atrium into what I may describe as the operating-room, in the middle of which stands the inclosed furnace, looking much like an operating-room, in the middle of which stands the inclosed furnace, looking much like an enlarged edition of the familiar laundry copper. The fire is kindled at the back of this furnace, and when at the proper moment released by the uplifting of iron shutters comes roaring through two large orifices and quickly fills the whole of the space where her its prey.
