FARMERS AND FARMING.

The Agriculturalist to Heware of Lightning

From the Germantown Telegraph. This class of individuals take special pains to go out among the honest farmers and make them the objects of their swindling operations. Their field of operations is th whole country, and they are extremely cautious about confining their operations to any one section for a great length of time, We notice by the Prairie Farmer that they are now operating in the state of Illinois.
