AMONG THE AGRICULTURISTS. The Interesting Facts Presented by the Boston Milk Inspector's Report—Something that Requires Constant Attention.

From the Germantown Telegraph. The twenty-sixth annual report of the Bos ton milk inspector presents some interesting facts. During the year 1884 there were sold in Boston no less than 3,375,390 pounds of oleomargarine, of the value of \$438,000. The 666 wholesale dealers in milk, in the city, sold collectively an average of 36,000 cans of milk per day, each can containing 8½ quarts of milk, which at the price of 40 cents per

can would, during the year, amount to \$5, There is a desire to obtain a purer quality in the milk, and so the inspector suggest that the morning's milk be retained in the country till after the evening milking, which shall be quickly cooled to about 40 degrees Fahrenheit, and then to be taken to the railroad station, go to Boston and be received by the milk wagons in the morning, and delivered directly to customers; in this way the inspector believes that the milk would, on an average, be twenty-four hours fresher than at present, and escarce all the danger due to exposure to air. escape all the danger due to exposure to air of most city milk wagon stables while being run through the cooler and put into small cans for distribution. The city consumer should learn to recognize the difference be-tween whole and skim milk. The average thickness of cream that will form upon milk, offer half a day standing should be about after half a day standing, should be about one-tenth the depth of the milk, but yet milk that has been skimmed and had colored water thrown upon it will again throw up just such a thin surface of cream as city peo-ple expect to find upon milk. The best au-thorities state that a cream is not to be considered worthy of its name if it contains less than 25 per cent. of butter fat. It may contain 90 per cent., yet so-called samples of crean from fairy rich Jersey milk have been taken to the inspector's office for analysis that contained only about 5 per cent of butter fat. The inspector believes that the milk supply needs to be subjected to some thing more than a chemical and microscopical examination. He believes that the coverexamination. He believes that the cowthemselves should be examined; also the stables in which they are kept, as regards sanitary conditions, ventilation, drainage and eleanliness of stalls and cows udders at the time of milking. Also the water and food proyided, to see that it is of a healthy character; and also the cleanliness of the can. If these important points are neglected, even though character and milerasconical examina-

though chemical and microscopical examina-tions fail to detect anything wrong, the milk may cause sickness and death. It is now firmly believed that many epidemics of typhoid fever, scarlet fever and other diseases have been known to have been occasioned by the use of faulty milk. the use of faulty milk. According to the records of the produce exchange not more than one-fourth of the imitation butter sold is sold under its true name, which is sufficient to warrant vig-grous legislation on the subject of fraudulent butter. In reference to vinegar the inspector recommends a true marking so as to dis recommends a true marking so as to dis-tinguish true cider vinegar from its colored and prepared imitations. These facts regard-ing Boston are equally true as applied to all our cities, and are such as present them-selves to the consideration of all consumers. It is evident that rigid legislation is de-

Requiring Conscant Attention There is probably no better evidence of the value of attention in the care of gardens than that which observation furnishes. The result of tillage can find no better illustration than that furnished by the gardens of men of ici sure, who use the garden as a means of leisure and so give it almost constant culti-vation. Given all other conditions the same, and the garden of him who at all times of leisure is found stirring the soil, will be almost double the value of the one of him who gives attention when the great growth of weeds actually demands the use of the hoe. In the one case the soil is kept continually stirred and loosened, the plants grow vigorously and produce abundantly of the best developed that their kind afford; no weeds are allowed to sop any plant nutriment from the soil. In the other case for want of stirring the soil becomes hard and besten down, weeds spring up and

other case for want of stirring the son becomes hard and beaten down, weeds spring up and draw fertility from the soil, and in consequence the vegetables grow slowly, are dwarfed in size, unproductive and of poor quality. This is no picture of imagination, but may be seen every day in passing from one garden to another. There is something pleasing in looking up a garden that is well kept and has vegetables of all kinds growing vigorously. It is a place where one can linger with satisfaction; but let the condition be changed and the impulse is to get away from the place as soon as possible.
