AN ARIZONA MYSTERY. Reported Murder of a Young Baltimore Cattle

From the Baltimore Sun. Intelligence has been received in Baltimore of the mysterious murder in Arizona of Aaron Katz, youngest son of Mr. Hirsch Kautz, which has recently come to light after several months of unexplained absence of Mr. Katz from his relatives, in Tucson, Argonia. The first intimation Mr. Katz had of the true whereabouts of his son, whom he had not given up, was from the murdered man's sister, Mrs. Etta Jacobs, wife of Mr. B. M. Jacobs, one of the officers of the bank of Tucson. Under date of June 29

she writes;
"I have such dreadful news to tell you that I actually do not know how to begin. You remember how worried we were about our Aaron. Well, we have at last found him, our Aaron. our Aaron. Well, we have at last found him, but found him murdered by the man who went with him to buy cattle. He has been killed three months, but we only found it out yesterday. It is so horrible that I cannot say much about it. It has made me sick." On March 22 Mr. Katz started from Tucson

On March 22 Mr. Katz started from Tucson on horseback for Sonora to purchase cattle, He was accompanied by an elderly Mexican named Pablo Soto, who has a family in Tucson. Mr. Katz took with him \$150 in cash and two certificates of deposit on the bank of Tucson for \$1,000 each. He was armed with a Winchester rifle, and it is said Soto was unarmed. Time wore on and nothing was heard from the travelers, although a report heard from the travelers, although a repor was current over a month ago that they had been seen in Sonora, their destination. On June 22 a pile of charred human bones, covered by partly-burned brush and logs, were tound on a trail east of the stage road to sasabe, 60 miles southwest of Tueson. The remains were placed in a sack and buried, and one of the discoverers was sent to Tueson with the information Mr. Marcus Katz, a brother of the deceased went out to where the remains were buried and had them exhumed. A piece of a pair and had them exhumed. A piece of a pair of trousers, a bunch of keys and a pocket knife were identified as the property of his missing brother. A sock and remains of boots were identified by Mrs. Soto as belonging to her husband, who accompanied young Katz. It was learned that the travelers stopped the first night at the Pena Blanc ranch, kept by a Mexican whose reputation is not good. Upon his arrival Mr. Katz handed a lot of silver to Soto to place in a bar, and then gave the bag to the landlord for safe-keeping. It was returned in the morning. It is said that Soto was a shiftless sort of faller. sort of a fellow, which gave rise to charging him with the murder. Several officials left Tueson to hunt up Soto's remains or his whereabouts. As it is, the murder is sur-rounded in mysters.

Aaron Katz left Baltimore in 1877, previous to which he was in the notion business with his father, on South Broadway. He first farmed in Graham county, Arizona, but about two years ago removed to Tueson, and was bookkeeper in the bank of his brother-in-law, B. M. Jacobs. He was in his thirtieth year.
