## INTOLERANCE WANING AWAY.

The Sects Losing Their Bitterness for Each Other and Judaism Exalted.

From the Memphis Appeal. One of the most gratifying results of the progress made in this age of progress is the decrease of intolerance. Old men can remember when it was common to hear a person spoken of as a very good sort of man but -he is a Methodist, or Catholic, or Baptist, or Episcopalian, as the case might be. In the churches there were perpetual provocative sermons, each sect proving that its views were right and all the rest wrong. These prejudices have not altogether disappeared, but they have no longer public countenance, and are retiring to the holes of the moles and other unclean creatures. In England such prejudices were much stronger than with ourselves, and when this cen-tury opened no "dissenter," that is, none who were not of the Established Church, could hold even a corporate office in his native town. At length the law excluding them, the "corporation and test excluding them, the "corporation and test acts," as they were called, were abolished, and gradually a better, more Christian sentiment prevailed. But it was long before toleration included the Jew. Whatever his abilities, however, high and honorable his character, the English law excluded him from holding office. At length the more intelligent among the people rose above the old narrowness, and to bring the subject strongly before the public London in 1849 strongly before the public London in 1849 elected a Jew, Baron Lionel de Rothschild, to Parliament. He was refused his seat, then the commons passed an act enabling Jews to sit in Parliament. The House of Lords, whose bishops and tories ruled, rejected it. Again and again the Commons passed the bill, and as often the bigotry of the Lords refused to sanction it. So the struggle went on, and the Lords never departed from their bigoted proceedings. In 1858 the commons as a matter connected with the administration of their own bouse, and therefore one with which the lords could not therefore one with which the lords could not interfere, adopted a resolution admitting the eligibility of Jews, and ten years from his first election Rothschild was admitted to his seat. It was not until 1871 that a Jew was admitted to the degree of master of arts at Oxford. Disraeli attained to rank though a oorn Jew, but as he had received Christian religion, the circumstances in his case were different. Still many of the Conserva-tive peers objected grumblingly even in his case. At length, in this year of 1885, the last fortress of British administrative and legislative biogtry has had to surrender. Sir Nathaniel de Rothschild has been made

a peer of the English realm, an act that is one of the grand deeds that distinguish the administration of Mr. Gladstone. Rothschild is no Disraeli, he is Jew in faith as well as by is no Disraeli, he is Jew in faith as well as by birth; he and his family everywhere are true to the old creed. For years they have fought the old prejudice and opposed the injustice that has been dealt out to their race for centuries. Their Judaism has been always prominent, there has been always prominent, there has been no surrender, no concession. The event is a memorable one, and Christianity may be congratulated that a stigma upon its history has been done away. To the Jew the act is a simple acknowledgment of the justice that was always due to him. To Christianity it is a removal of what

him. To Christianity it is a removal of what gave the lie to its professions. Its sublime originator was a Jew, his mother was a Jewess, the Martha and Mary and Lazarus and the disciples whom he loved, were al Jews. To persecute and ostracise those of his race was a stigma of shame to the people who called themselves his followers. Thank God it is removed in England. May the time soon come when every Christian nation will go and do likewise. Advice to the Clergy.
